SHELburne, Ont., Sept. 5.—Miss Mary Stewart, who has for some time past been keeping house for her father, Thomas Stewart, of Maple Valley, a few miles from here, was found drowned in the mill pond yesterday. When the men came home for dinner they found that dinner had not been prepared and Mary was missing. A search was instituted with the result that her body was found floating in the mill pond near the house. It is supposed to have been an accident, but no particulars are known as yet.

DURHAM, Ont., Sept. 6.—A very sad accident occurred yesterday afternoon at Latona, in Glenelg township, by which James Young lost his life. Mr. Young had driven to a neighbor's, a distance of a mile and a half, on a road cart and when ready to return drove over a little knoll with one wheel of the cart, upsetting him off and landing him on his head. The shock produced concussion of the spine, which caused his death in two minutes. The deceased was about 67 years of age and leaves a wife and large family, all of whom are grown up and in fair circumstances. They have the sympathy of the whole community in their sudden bereavement.

20 Days in a Hollow Log.

Instances are numerous of the tenacity with which animals retain life under adverse circumstances, but few are of as much local interest as an occurrence in this vicinity of a few days ago, on the farm of Mr. W. J. Gould, near the south-eastern limits of this town. Mr. Gould has a fine flock of sheep and like most other sheep raisers occasionally suffers from having his flocks chased by the dogs of the neighborhood. Early in the month of August his stock was subjected to this annoyance, but with no serious result other than the disappearance of a fine Southdown ewe. After diligent search it was concluded that in the animal's endeavor to escape from her pursuers she had dropped into a crevice or fallen over a cliff, and the search was abandoned. On Friday last while Mr. Gould's son was out in the bush looking for the ewe he was startled by the appearance of a head of an animal of some kind sticking out through the side of a large elm log. He ran home and informed a brother, and the two went out to investigate the strange sight. Imagine their surprise when it was found that the head sticking out of the small aperture was that of the missing ewe. With the assistance of an axe the imprisoned animal was freed after a period of 20 days. It was found that the log was hollow at one end and was quite decayed, and during the incarceration the animal had eaten through about six inches of the rotten wood, making the hole through which her head protruded. It is supposed that in the attempt to escape, the ewe had sought shelter in the log and had not sufficient intelligence to back out. She was one of the fattest of the flock before her imprisonment, and though very weak and emaciated, is now able to walk around and partake of fodder and is quite a curiosity in the neighborhood.—[O. 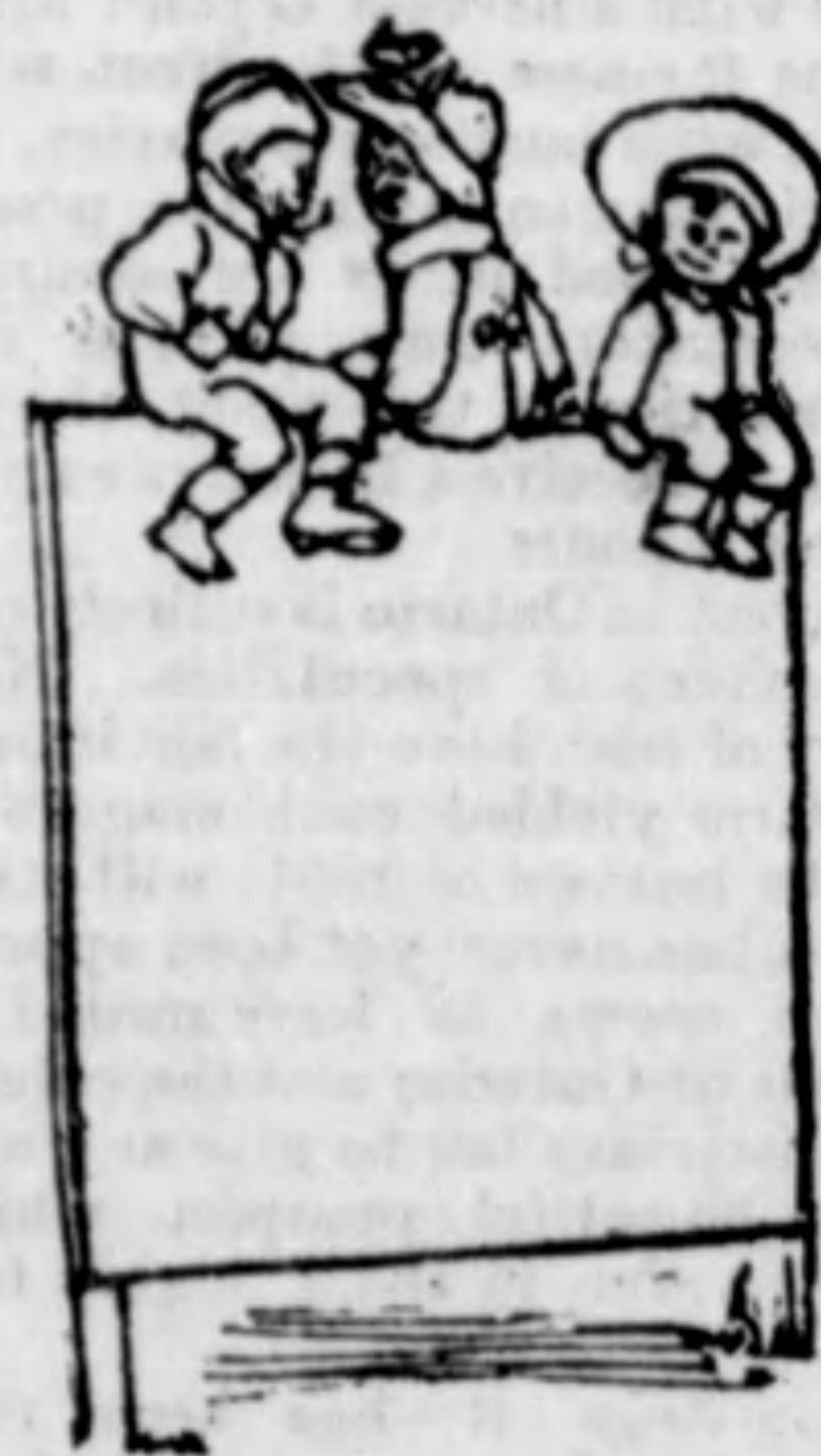
