If the creditor chooses to sell it and announces his intention of doing so in terms that imply that the debtor could pay if he choose, the creditor does not exceed his legal rights, and the debtor has no legal redress for any injury such public notice may have caused him.

From Montana. The Advance received a letter last week from a young gentleman well known in this vicinity, viz., Mr. Thor. Hollinger, who for some time was with Mr. R. Trimble here. Mr. Hollinger is now in Havre, Montana, doing a good business in the mercantile line in company with another gentleman named Skylstead. Tommy writes an interesting letter, a few sentences from which we are sure he will pardon us for reproducing. He writes:

Since I entered into business here I have been very successful. We have had a good trade ever since we started, although when we located here we only intended to remain until we disposed of our stock of goods which had arrived for us previous to erecting our tent. Our intention, when we left St. Paul, was to locate at or near the Rockies, but on look-

ing matters over we found it impossible to get our goods hauled on account of bad roads, and freight rates on the same would cost 15 per cent. from here. When we opened our stock we cut prices very close, and the result was that we got our opposition's customers, which we have managed to hold ever since. Just now there is quite a boom here owing to the Great Northern Railroad putting in their shops, round house and yards, and making the same a tripple divisional railroad point. At present there are about 20 frame business buildings under construction, and along with about 500 laborers, mechanics, etc., it makes the place quite lively. We have our building almost completed, which is 24x50 and 35 feet high, and when we move into the same we expect to enjoy more solid comfort, so to speak, as it was very disagreeable doing business in a tent, owing to the severe wind and sand storms which this climate is subject to. The country surrounding here could not be beat for raising crops when they have a rainy wet season. I have bought potatoes this fall that turns the beam on a scale at 24lbs., and cabbages that weigh as much as 22 lbs. I bought one load of cabbages this week that averaged 19 lbs. each. This country is unsettled yet, with the exception of along the Milk Creek valley, which is pretty well settled up now. I took up a ranch of 160 acres adjoining this town and erected a house on it. The land is excellent for raising crops and should the season be dry it would be an easy matter to irrigate it. I don't regret the day I left Flesherton. I have come to the conclusion that unless a young man ventures he cannot expect to accomplish much. This is a wild uncivilized place. No churches, society, or anything of a moral nature to be found—nothing but drinking and sporting do the people think of, but once the town is properly started we will quite likely have better law and order.

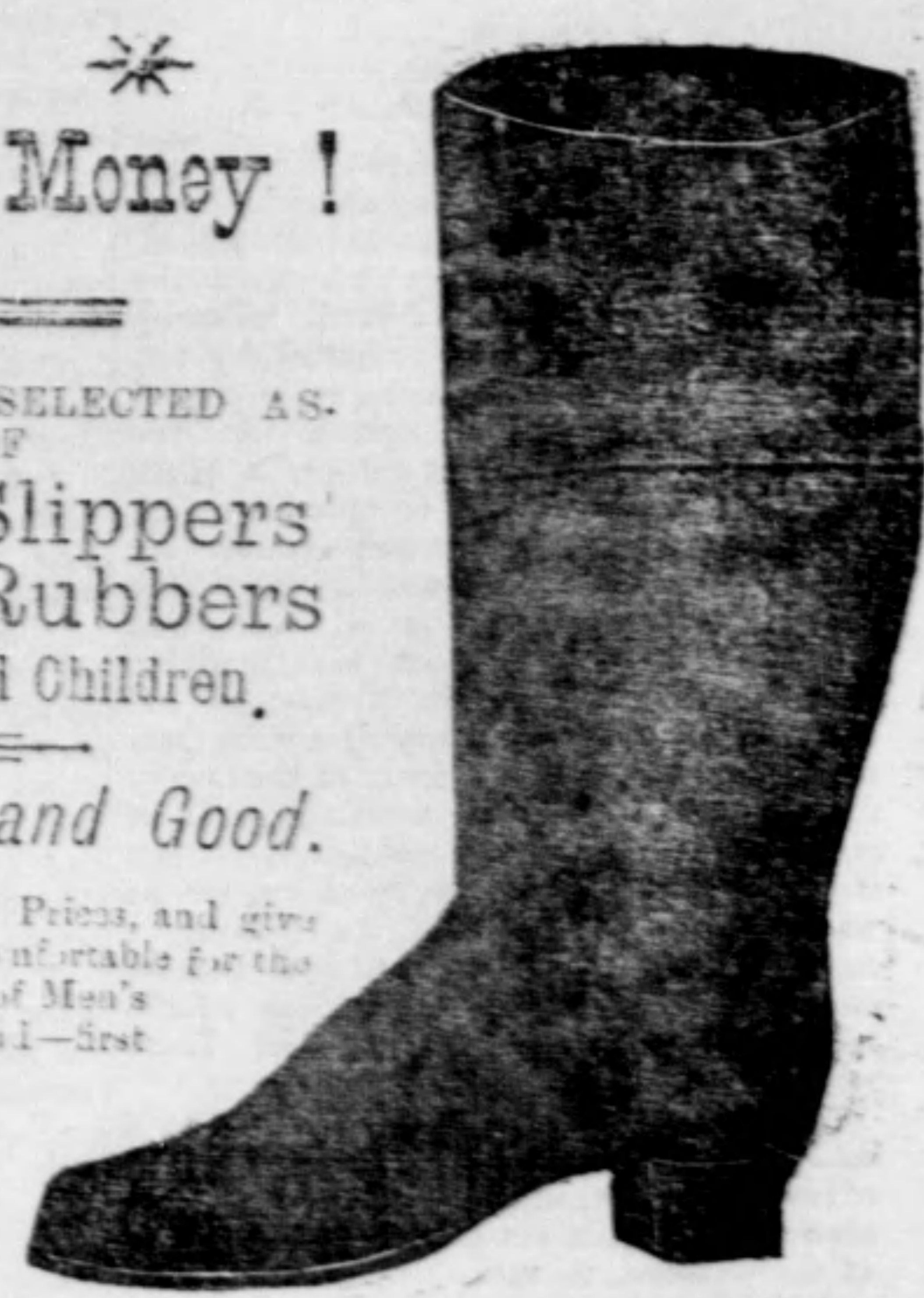
