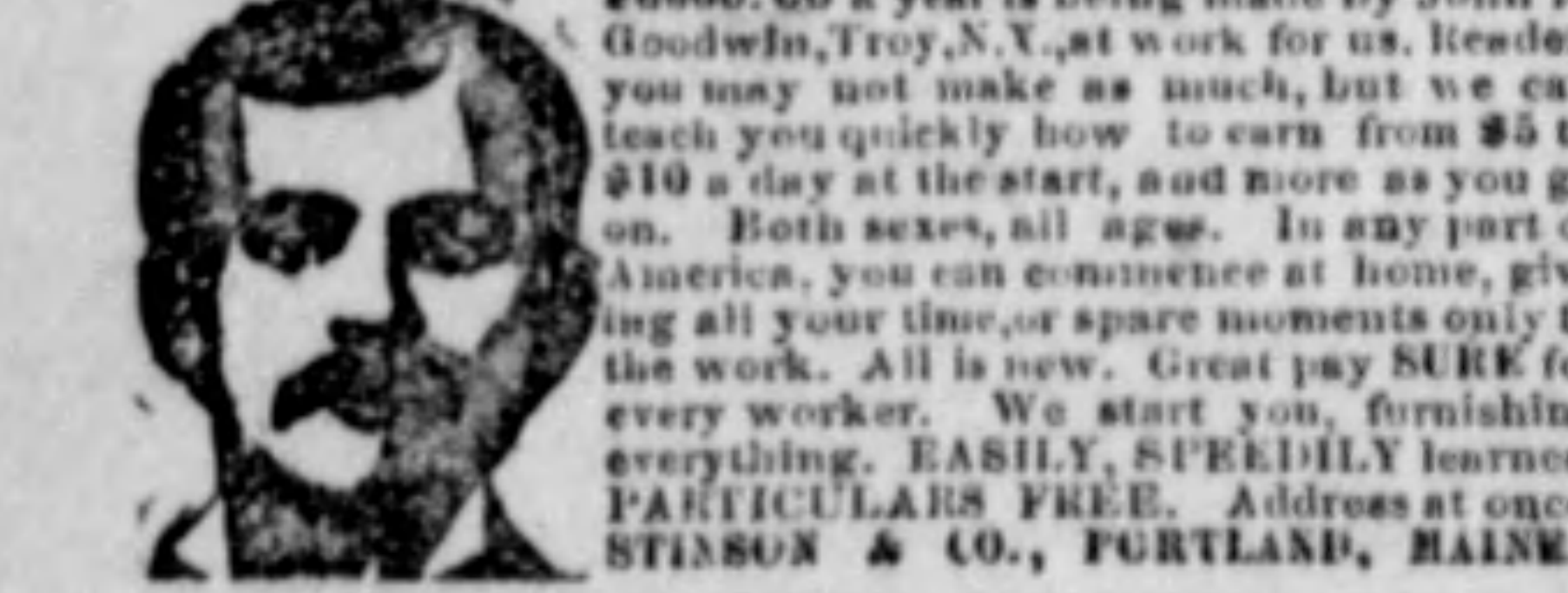

COUNTY AND DISTRICT.

Hay thieves are on the rampage near Streetsville.

The South Grey election trial has again been postponed, this time until Dec. 15th.

Frank McMaster got three months at Orangeville for stealing \$42 from the residence of James Rusk, of Mono.

A second count by the police of the vacant houses in the city of Toronto shows that there are 4,243, including 564 stores.

The water in the Saugeen river at Hanover was never known to be so high in the fall as it was last week. Trains north and south were cancelled owing to the overflow.

An immense quantity of lumber and timber is shipped from Hepworth each year. Some idea of the quantity of lumber can be had when it is known that one mill, that of C. H. Witthun & Co., sawed last year over 3,000,000 feet, principally hard wood.

The Mt. Forest cheese factory made one hundred thousand pounds of cheese this season, an increase of ten tons over last year's output. The Co. sold the fall make for 9¢. to Mr. Brill, of Guelph, for shipment to the old country. The total income from the season's sales is \$0,000. —[Representative.

From Shelburne comes rumors of a strange mishap that occurred there one day last week. It is said that an Amaranth farmer got hold of a bottle of ammonia instead of whiskey in a drug store there one night and that, as a result of the dose he swallowed, his life has been in jeopardy since. Another story has it that it was whiskey he drank, all right enough, but an over-dose of Shelburne "bug-juice," which is well-known to be as dangerous as Rough on Rats, proved too much for him.—[Orangeville Advertiser.

The Hanover Post man had an encounter with burglars the other night, and this is his modest version of it: "About one o'clock yesterday morning a tramp or burglar attempted to force an entrance into the residence of the writer but the watch dog stood him off. Later on we appeared on the scene and intimated that it might be as well for him to make his business known. For answer he placed himself behind a tree. We then called for our six-shooter, which had the desired effect, for his trampship made a break for the fence and started north up the townline. Hastily summoning our dog we started in pursuit, but were unable to overtake him, owing to the fact of his having the better of us on the start."

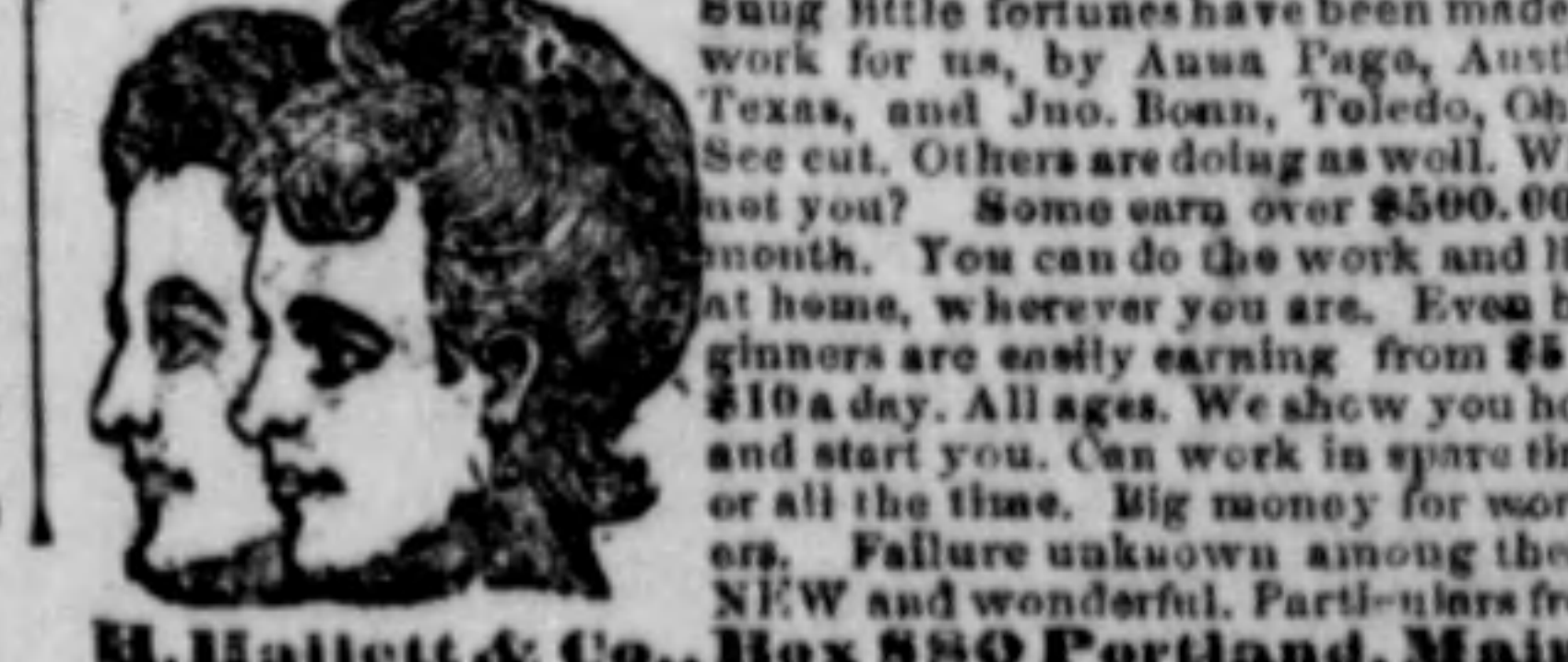
