Osprey Council.
SECOND MEETING.
The Council of Osprey met in the Orange Hall, Faversham, on Saturday, Feb. 20th. Members all present, the Reeve in the chair.
Minutes of last meeting read and signed. Communications read from Alex. Cameron re dividing statute labor division on town-line Osprey and Collingwood, and town-line Osprey and Nottawasaga. Request granted. From C. W. Rutledge, re printing, etc. From County Treasurer, list of land liable to be sold in Osprey in 1892. From F. L. Wright, road machines. From Flora McArthur, re keep of Margaret McInnes, indigent. From auditor's report of receipts and expenditure for 1891. From Arthur L. Wilson, re Canadian Municipal Journal.

On motion the auditor's report for 1891 was read and adopted, and the clerk was instructed to publish it according to law.
Bylaw No. 296 to appoint Overseers of Highways, Fence Viewers and Pound Keepers, and bylaw No. 297 to appoint Health Officers for 1892 received their several readings and passed.
The collector was instructed to receive the taxes on lot 35, con. 6, less \$6.65 being the amount charged for statute labor in 1888, and interest, the pathmaster for that year having certificate that the work was performed.
The treasurer was instructed to pay as follows: To Robt. Beatty, indigent, \$2.00. To union school section, Nottawasaga and Osprey, error in levy of 1890 91 cents, and balance of levy of 1891, \$9.50; James Potts as auditor, \$10; Richard Heron, as auditor, \$8; Flora McArthur \$1.75 per week to be paid every four weeks for keep of Margaret McInnes, indigent.
Council adjourned to meet at Melville on March 21st next.
The list of Highways, Fence Viewers and Pound Keepers will be given next week.

A Glenelg Boy.
Rev. W. H. W. Boyle, B. A., whose parental home is a few miles from Markdale was converted early in life and when but a young man, in his student days labored on the Berkley mission and preached with his wonted earnestness and with acceptance to many neighboring congregations. He lives in the hearts and is held in high esteem by many readers of the Standard who will be anxious to know something of his work while separated from them, and his present affliction. Graduating from Knox College Mr. Boyle was called to the pastorate of a large congregation in Paris, Ont. After four years of successful ministry there, he then accepted a call from the church in St. Thomas with two years of joyful ministry there. During his pastorate of these charges nearly four hundred souls were led to trust in Jesus their Saviour. In the midst of happy toil came the collapse like a flash of lightning out of a clear sky upon the overworked young pastor; thirty-five successive attacks of bleeding from the lungs, leave of absence to Colorado Springs for nearly a year, then resignation, being advised by his physician that he would not be able to use his voice for public speaking for another year, if that. Being unable to witness from the pulpit Mr. Boyle resolved to use his pen praying that in this way the Lord would make him instrumental in winning souls for Himself. His first book, a neat little volume now out of the publisher's hands entitled "Footholds for Faith's Feet" contains six sermons on famous hymns and their authors and succinct account of the authors' lives followed by a practical discussion and relation of incidents associated with the history of each hymn. The little volume is intensely interesting. Being stimulated and benefitted by real-its pages of song and story, we commended it to others, praying with the author that it may be made instrumental under the blessing of God, in the awakening, quickening and comforting of souls. Mr. Boyle at present reports some improvement in his condition. — [Markdale Standard.]
