COUNTY AND DISTRICT.

The Stayner Sun says that town wants so many things that it is ashamed to mention them. We can easily believe it.

A special train of five carloads of freight and about seventy settlers passed over the Durham branch of the G. T. R., Monday, bound for Manitoba and the Northwest.

It pays to grow the best grain even in this down-trodden, government ground, N. P. destroyed, and politically demoralized country, as our Reform friends term it. Witness the following from the Stayner Sun: "Mr. Findlay Campbell, grain buyer for A. V. DeLaport, Toronto, purchased from Mr. Wm. Fergie 500 bushels of marrowfat peas, paying 77c. a bushel. These peas were grown on Mr. Fergie's farm in Sunnidale. Mr. F. Campbell also bought from Mr. W. Copson, Sunnidale, a car of the same kind of peas paying the same price. These two cars of peas were shipped direct to the Old Country."

On Thursday last the large bank barns of Mr. Gourley, in Minto, a mile and a half west of Harriston, together with the grain, hay, feed and implements, were destroyed by fire. Mr. Gourley left home with a cow to sell at the fair, about eight o'clock. The hired man left about nine o'clock, and as there was no one else about the farm, the cause of the fire is hard to explain. Fortunately Mr. Gourley returned home about noon, and when some distance from home he noticed smoke issuing from his barn. He made all haste and reached the barn in time to loosen all the horses and cattle and turn them out. He next tried to get into the main barn in order to save some of the implements, but was too late. The barn and contents were insured in the Howick Mutual Fire Insurance Co. for about \$750, but this will not cover the loss.—[Mt. Forest Rep.
