Death of Donald McLean.

We are this week called upon to record the death of Mr. Donald McLean, of Priceville, who passed away on Monday afternoon, after a week's illness, aged 61 years. Mr. McLean was one of the early settlers of Priceville, having moved there over thirty years ago, shortly after the village had been laid out by the government as a town plot. With the exception of about 9 years spent in Detroit, he and his family have resided there ever since. The deceased was of an affable and genial disposition, and his death is deeply regretted in that neighborhood. He leaves eight children to mourn his loss—three sons and five daughters. One of the sons resides in Detroit; one is in Lake City, Mich.; and one lived with his father at Priceville. The daughters are Mrs. D. M. Steele, of Ionia, Mich.; Mrs. Thompson, Bay City, Mich.; Mrs. R. L. Mortimer, Shelburne; Mrs. J. C. Maclean and Mrs. Louis Sautler, Toronto. The remains were interred last Thursday in the Priceville burying ground. —Shelburne Free Press.

The Ontario Legislature will make a general tightening up of the game laws this session some of the features of which will be that only twelve black bass may be caught in one day, and 15 lbs. of speckled trout. Deer hunting will probably be totally prohibited for five years in the counties of Grey, Bruce and Simcoe, and a game park, as suggested by this paper a year ago, will become one of our institutions, to be situated in northern Muskoka, or Nipissing. These are reforms which no true sportsman, and no one who has a desire to see our native animals and fishes protected, will wish to see defeated.
