The budget of news from here has not been very full for some time. Weather has been cold. Fall wheat and grass are springing up nicely in consequence of seasonable rains. The prospects are becoming better than our fears, I suppose because we are naturally cowards, or we do not trust implicitly the promise that spring time and harvest shall not cease.

The harvest of death seems to have been unusually great among us. Edward Hawton, Mr. Milligan and Mr. Davidson have been gathered home to sleep with their fathers. We are travellers on a journey that can only be travelled once. We drop down tired, exhausted and dead; one here, another there; none of us knowing who will be next.

Mrs. Hickling has been seriously ill, and one of Mr. Milligan's children also. The world's broad field of battle contains many heroes, but none are more heroic than our enfeebled mothers and daughters who wait on and watch over the sick at the peril of their own lives. God will reward them.

The late Geo. Davidson and his wife came from Aberdeenshire about forty years ago and settled in Pickering about 32 years since. They then settled in Osprey and cleaned up a bush farm, lot 17, con. 8, where he has continuously resided since. His wife was a large-hearted neighbor, mother and friend. On one occasion when carrying succor to the sick she burst a blood vessel. Her help in seasons of need was often instant and unsifted. They lost their son James at 27 years—a very promising young man. The late Mr. Davidson was secretary and treasurer of the Faversham Presbyterian church, and for a long time manager and secretary of the Faversham Grange, which has sustained in his death a serious loss. His business he transacted to within about a week of his death—far too long. But it may be said that he put off the harness of work with reluctance. About a year ago heart-failure became manifest, and reappeared lately, and cut him off in a way similar to that of his wife six years ago. Everything that affection could suggest was done by his daughters to assuage the pangs of his final moments. He was quiet, intelligent and observing, but somewhat reserved in manner. He had the faculty of seeing the inwardness of most things submitted to his judgement, and his natural shrewd sense was many times a match even for college bred sharpers. He won and held for long the confidence and esteem of a wide circle. His defects will be forgotten in his public worth and uprightness; a kind neighbor and a constant friend. He will be sincerely regretted and long remembered by the many who had the pleasure of his acquaintance.
