Artemesia Fall Fair.

Artemesia Agricultural Society had exceptionally fine weather for their exhibition, which was held at Priceville, on Tuesday and Wednesday of last week. It was one of those balmy, beautiful autumn days, and the yeomanry of Artemesia, Gleneg and Proton took full advantage thereof. There was a larger turnout of people than ever has been before at this fair, and all appeared to think they were having a good time. The show in the hall was fully up to the record, excepting in one or two lines, notably that of ladies work, in which the entries were few. Grain and roots were good, as also was fruit. In the hall our friend, Mr. C. C. James, had a special exhibit of harness, native robes and leather. Judging by these exhibits it would be impossible to outdo Mr. James as a tanner. The finish on some of the sides of leather shown was simply beautiful, and one could almost use them for looking glasses. We noticed one young lady endeavoring through that medium to find out if her bangs were standing at the proper angle, and she seemed satisfied. Cattle, sheep and horses were out in good force. In sheep and Devons Messrs. J. Oliver and W. Meads were the principal exhibitors, taking, as they always do, almost innumerable prizes.
