Council held their regular meeting at Bell's Corners on February 14th, members all present, Reeve in the chair.  
Corbett—Watson—The Collector's Roll be accepted and he receive his pay, \$80.00, also \$5.00 for postage and stationery and \$5.00 expenses in regard to lot 231, R. 3.—Carried.  
Watson—Shaw—The bill of H. E. Glendon for stationery etc., \$3.98 be paid.—Carried.  
Corbett—Watson—Jno. Doyle be paid 50 cents for repairing road scraper, Div. 1. (Division money.)—Carried.  
Corbett—Laughlin—The Council be paid \$4.00 each for two days in council.—Carried.  
Shaw—Watson—Pathmasters be appointed to govern both sideroads and townline between West Luther and Proton. The Pathmaster be instructed to put on equal amount of statute labor with West Luther, and any excess of labor over the above amount put on the sideroads in their respective beats. The Clerks be requested to exchange returns as to work performed each year on the townline between Luther and Proton and the Reeve is authorized to sign the agreement between West Luther and Proton.—Carried.  
Laughlin—Watson—The petition of ratepayers applying to form Union Schools be received, also John Mulhall in requesting change from School 11 to School 14.—Carried.  
Laughlin—Shaw—A committee composed of Messrs. Corbett, Watson and R. Black be empowered to meet committee of Artemesia on matters relative to townline, at Proton Station on Friday, March 3rd, prox., at 10 a. m., the Clerk to notify Artemesia council.—Carried.  
Laughlin—Shaw—The petition of Jas. Funston and four others for draining part of 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Concessions be received. The township Engineer to make necessary survey and report to council. Clerk to furnish him with copy of petition.—Carried.  
Laughlin—Watson—That the council adjourn to meet at John Connor's Hotel, Dundalk, on Saturday the 11th March, at 10 o'clock a. m.—Carried.
