General Sessions.

His Honor Judge Crozier held the regular sessions of the county Court in the Court House on Tuesday. The work of the court was light, only two cases coming to trial. There were no criminal cases. The Grand Jury elected Wm. Garvie, Esq., foreman.

On the opening of the court, His Honor addressed the Grand Jury congratulating them on the fact that there would be no cases before them. They then proceeded to examine the jail and county buildings and in the afternoon made their presentation to the judge. The presentation was very brief. It referred in congratulatory terms to the lack of crime in the county, and stated that the jail had been found in an excellent condition of cleanliness and order. The following cases were tried during the day:—

McDermid v. Hind.—The parties live near Keady, and the action was brought by the plaintiff, as landlord, to recover from his tenant, the defendant, the value of a barn, which the latter had agreed to build in lieu of rent. The defendant contended that the barn was to be built within three years, but the lease called for it to be built the second year. The claim of the plaintiff was for \$200. Judgment for the plaintiff, \$100 and costs. A. G. MacKay for plaintiff. H. G. Tucker for defendant.

The second case was VanDusen v. Wilkinson, an action about some sheep. This case was adjourned to Saturday, 24, inst., at 10 a. m.

The last case was the trial of an appeal from a magistrate's conviction at Dundalk. The magistrate convicted a constable for trespassing on the premises of a Mrs. Moody and shooting a dog which the constable claimed had no tag as required by law. His Honor reserved judgment on some points, but the conviction will probably stand. Wright & Lucas for appellant, A. G. MacKay for defence.—Times.
