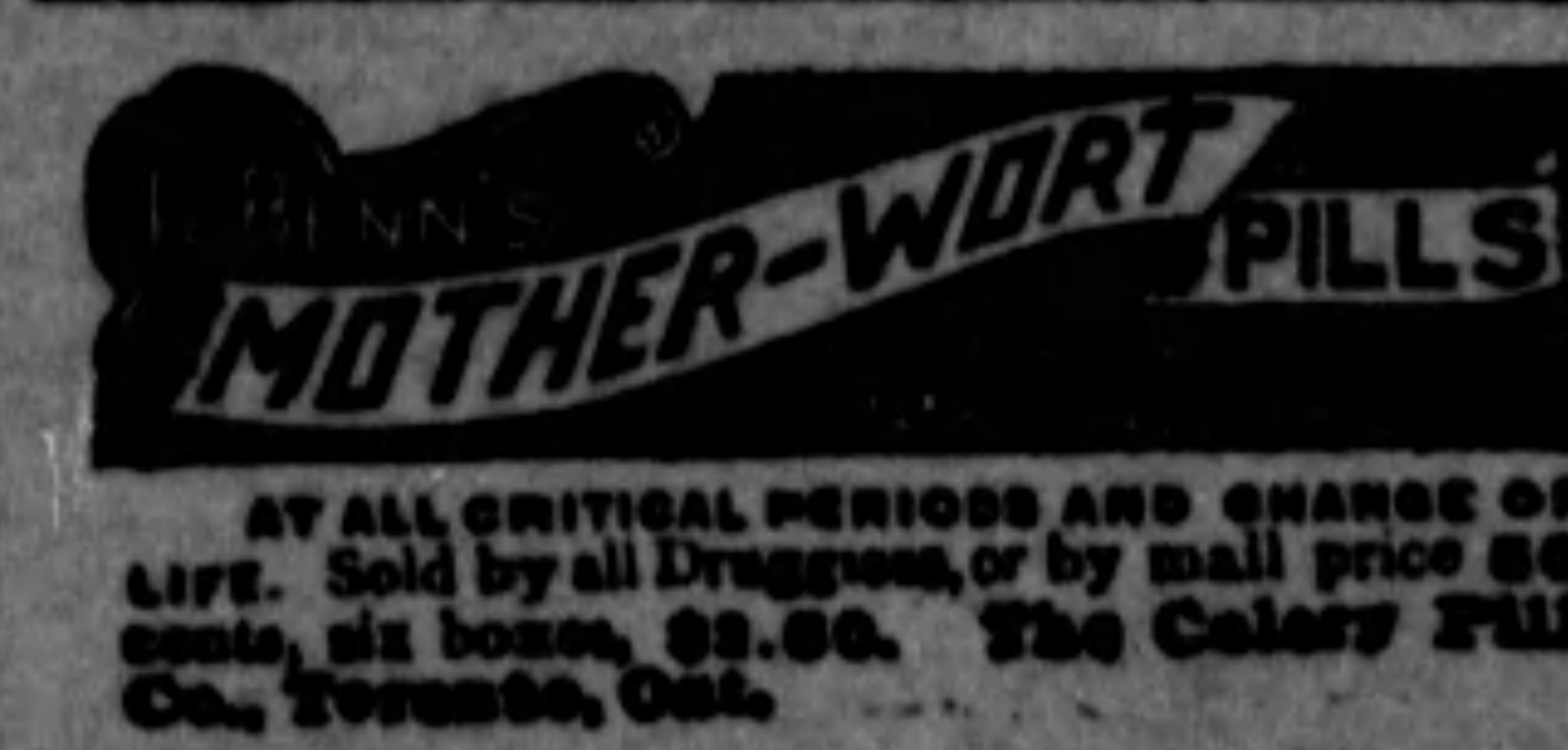

**Kimberley.**

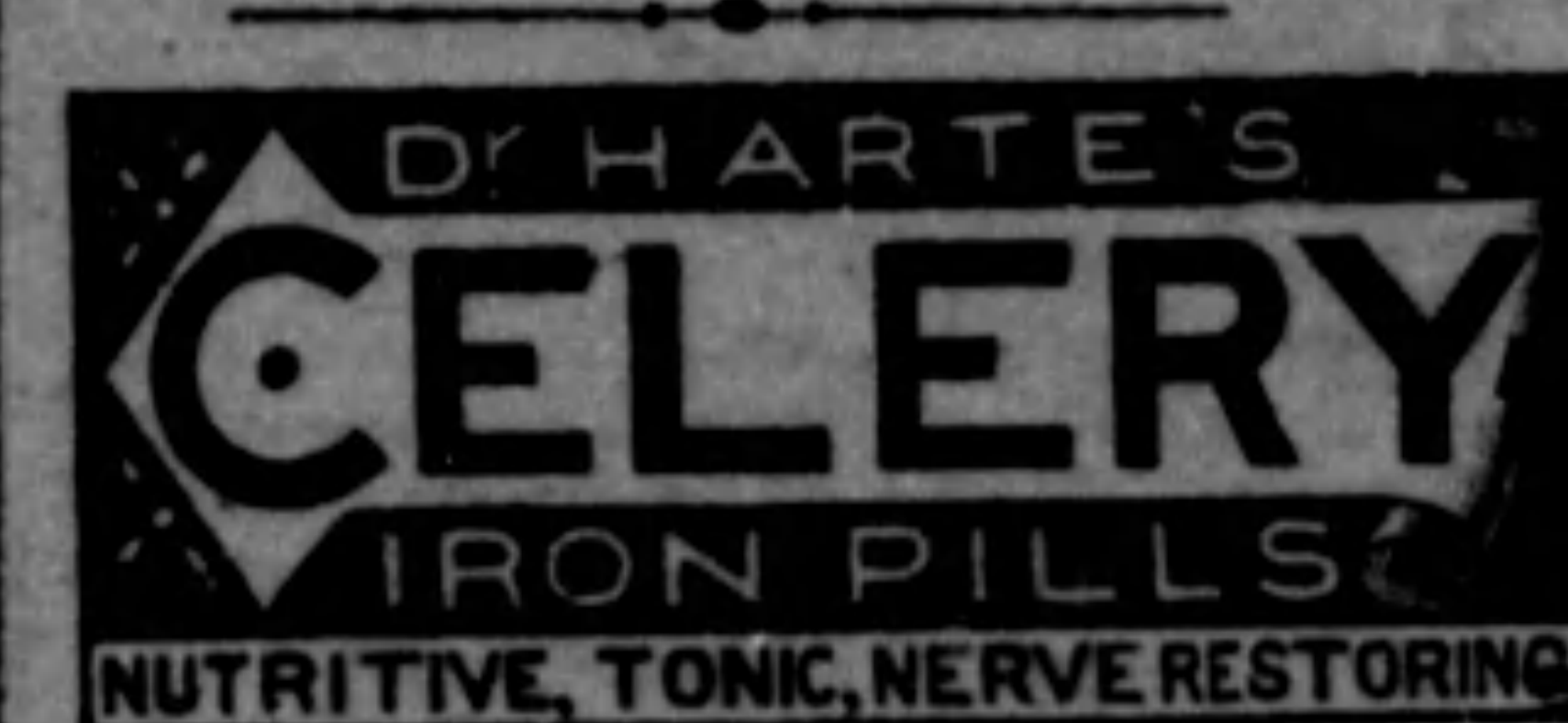
From our own Correspondent.
