The horses were brought to a standstill by a breakage in the harness or she would have been literally hacked to pieces. As it was her left leg was completely severed, her right almost so, and several deep body gashes were inflicted. Drs. Cooke, of Desboro, and McCullough, of Chatsworth, were called in, but owing to the enormous amount of blood lost, they were unable to save her life. She died while her wounds were being dressed.

**One Man's Downfall.**

Last Friday Wm. McDonald, a tramp by profession, was brought over from Neustadt by constable Siegmann and introduced to magistrates Proctor and Messinger. The introduction was coupled with the charge of being drunk and disorderly on the streets of Neustadt. The old man pled guilty and was fined \$1 and costs with the option of twenty days in gaol. He took the option with the best grace imaginable, explaining that his funds were exhausted by his late carousal, and is now at Owen Sound recuperating his exhausted energies at the county's expense. Bill McDonald, the tramp, once saw better days. He is an American by birth and previous to the war was wealthy. His father, at his death, left an estate of 27 million dollars to his two sons. Part of this estate was a plantation on which were 1500 slaves. When the war broke out the brothers donned the grey and marched to the front and fought for the Confederacy; one was killed and the other at seventy-four years of age is a poor, miserable tramp and occupies to-day a cell in a common gaol. At the close of the war, McDonald, bankrupt in purse, moved his wife and children into New Orleans where they were taken down with yellow fever and died. McDonald lost heart and took to drink and became a wanderer, and will shortly occupy as nameless a grave as does his brother in one of the battle fields of the "Lost Cause" away off in the Sunny South.—Hanover Post.
