Artemesia Fall Fair.

Artemesia fall fair was held at Priceville last Wednesday, and was probably the most successful ever held there. The day was warm and balmy, and farmers turned out in large numbers. This Priceville show has the reputation of being equal to any township show in the county. This year it was superior to any we have attended, in almost every respect. The inside exhibit was placed in Watson's hall, which was more commodious than the hall in which it is generally held. The grain exhibit was especially good this year. Roots were beyond the average.
