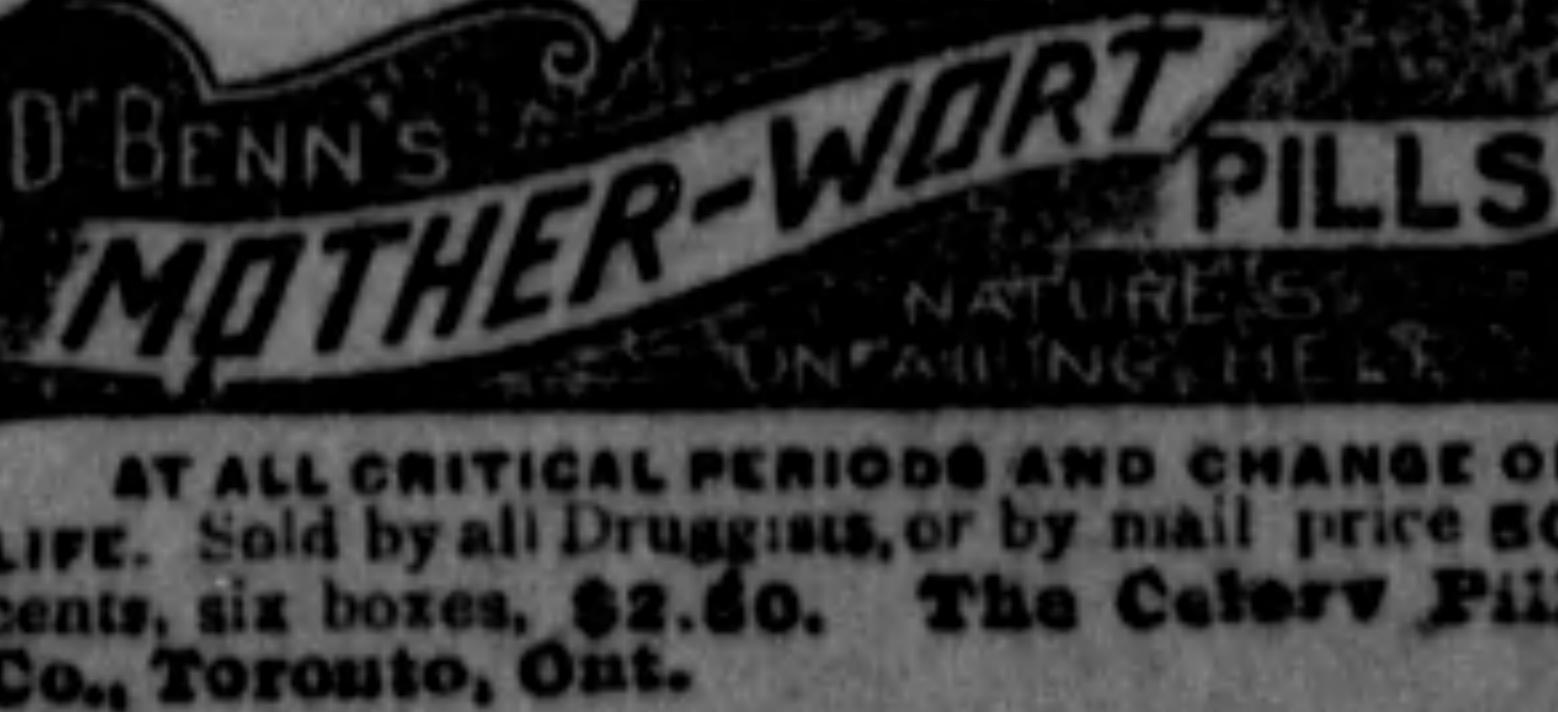

The Artemesia agricultural society held its annual fall show here on the 10th and 11th inst. The weather on those days was the finest we have had this fall.
