A Centenarian Gone.

The Parry Sound Star announces the death of Mr. Julius Ainslie on Dec. 28th. Mr. Ainslie was a resident of Flesherton for some years and the following from the Star with reference to the deceased gentlemen will be of interest to our readers.

The deceased gentlemen was the second son of the Rev. Wm. Ainslie, rector, in the county of Down, Ireland, and was born toward the close of the 18th century. At an early age Mr. Ainslie entered the Military College at Woolwich, in due time became attached to the Artillery service of the English army, and was among those sent to guard the entrance to the Black Forest of Belgium, so as to prevent Napoleon at the time of the Battle of Waterloo, taking possession of this strategic point. From the conspicuous position a great part of this famous battle was observable, and the deceased never tired relating the various incidents of that engagement.

Shortly after the close of this war and the retirement of Napoleon to St. Helena the deceased sold out of the Artillery service and entered the University of Edinburgh, intending to qualify eventually for holy orders, he prosecuted his studies with assiduity for a while, but never took either his degree or orders. Being of an ardent and impetuous nature he early became bitterly involved in the Roman Catholic Emancipation struggle then taking place in Ireland, and as such was a prominent and pronounced Orangeman, and his proudest boast was that his name gave to Orangeism its first Grand-Master, in the person of Richard, the first Earl of Ainslie.

Since those troubles ceased and after the passage of the Emancipation Bill in 1829, the deceased never held any further connection with the Orange order. During the same year he left Ireland in company with his uncle, Captain Alfred Ainslie, R. N., and visited Africa, India and parts of China. Captain Ainslie being ordered to the North American waters, Mr. Ainslie accompanied him, and spent two years between Montreal, Quebec, Halifax and the West Indies. About this time, on the death of his uncle he became owner of two townships in (then) Lower Canada, and for some years followed lumbering, getting wearied of a life for which he was unqualified he sold out again and invested in a plot of land, buildings and business at St. Eustache, and was in a prosperous condition till the misfortune and losses attending the unfortunate rebellion of 1837-8 reduced him to the position of a poor man.

About this time Mr. Ainslie visited the districts of Western Canada for the first time and finally settled in the township of Chinguacousy, in the county of Peel, where he married Anna, the youngest daughter of the late Major James Campbell, with whom he lived for fifty-two years, and had issue three sons and two daughters, and remarkable to relate his own was the first death that occurred in this family during all these years. Of this family the eldest son Mr. J. M. Ainslie is our townsman and postmaster, the youngest son is Mr. Alfred Ainslie of the firm of Gillespie, Ainslie & Dixon, wholesale merchants, Toronto. The two daughters have always resided with their parents, and are therefore residents of our town.

In 1859 the deceased with his family moved to Flesherton in the county of Grey where he lived till 1869, when the attractions of a new country and its great water facilities induced him to settle at Parry Sound, to which place he became much attached, and always delighted in sketching a hopeful and brilliant future for our town. In person and manner he was cultured, refined and retired, rarely taking more than a personal interest in the affairs of the town, and in the political questions of the country. He kept pace with all questions of the day, whether religious or political and while voting nearly always with the Conservative party, he reserved the right to place the interests of the town or country at all times superior to those of either class or party.

His illness was of short duration and was not considered serious till a short time before his death. He suffered very little, and retained the full possession of all his faculties till within a few minutes of his departure. His last words distinctly uttered were—"Don't you see it? I see it! The sea of glass!" In a few moments he expired as peacefully as a child.
