The county of Wellington house of industry cared for an average of 40 inmates during the eleven months ending 30th of November, 1893, at the cost of \$1.27 per week. The farm is in a high state of cultivation, the surplus products during that period having sold for \$686. The institution is situated adjoining the town of Welland, and prison labor is utilized in tile draining the farm and other permanent improvements. The employment of prison labor is worthy of consideration by municipalities proposing to establish similar institutions.—Municipal World.
