**Another Costly Fire.**

HARRISON'S AND KARSTEDT'S BLOCK WIPED OUT.

Once more has Flesherton had to tussle with the fire fiend. Citizens were awakened about four o'clock on Tuesday morning by the ringing of the alarm bell to find the business block of E. Harrison, furniture dealer, and F. G. Karstedt, tin and hardware, in flames. The crowd that gathered in an incredibly short time went nobly to work and succeeded in saving the complete stocks of both firms before the flames reached them, the fire having originated in an upper story. Both gentlemen who lived over their respective places of business, lost all their household furniture and clothing. Mr. Karstedt's portion of the building was owned by himself and carried no insurance on building or stock. Mr. Harrison's loss will be well covered by insurance. The building which he occupied was owned by Mrs. Roger Lever, and was insured for \$700 in the Waterloo. Mr. Harrison's stock was insured for \$800 in the Lancashire, and his household furniture for \$1000 in the Gore Mutual. Temporary premises have been secured by both gentlemen to carry on their business.

The cause of fire is a mystery, and several theories have been advanced. It started in Mr. Harrison's premises in or near the kitchen.

Mr. Karstedt's loss will be heavy, as he carried no insurance, and lost his building, household furniture, tools, clothing, two gold watches, etc.

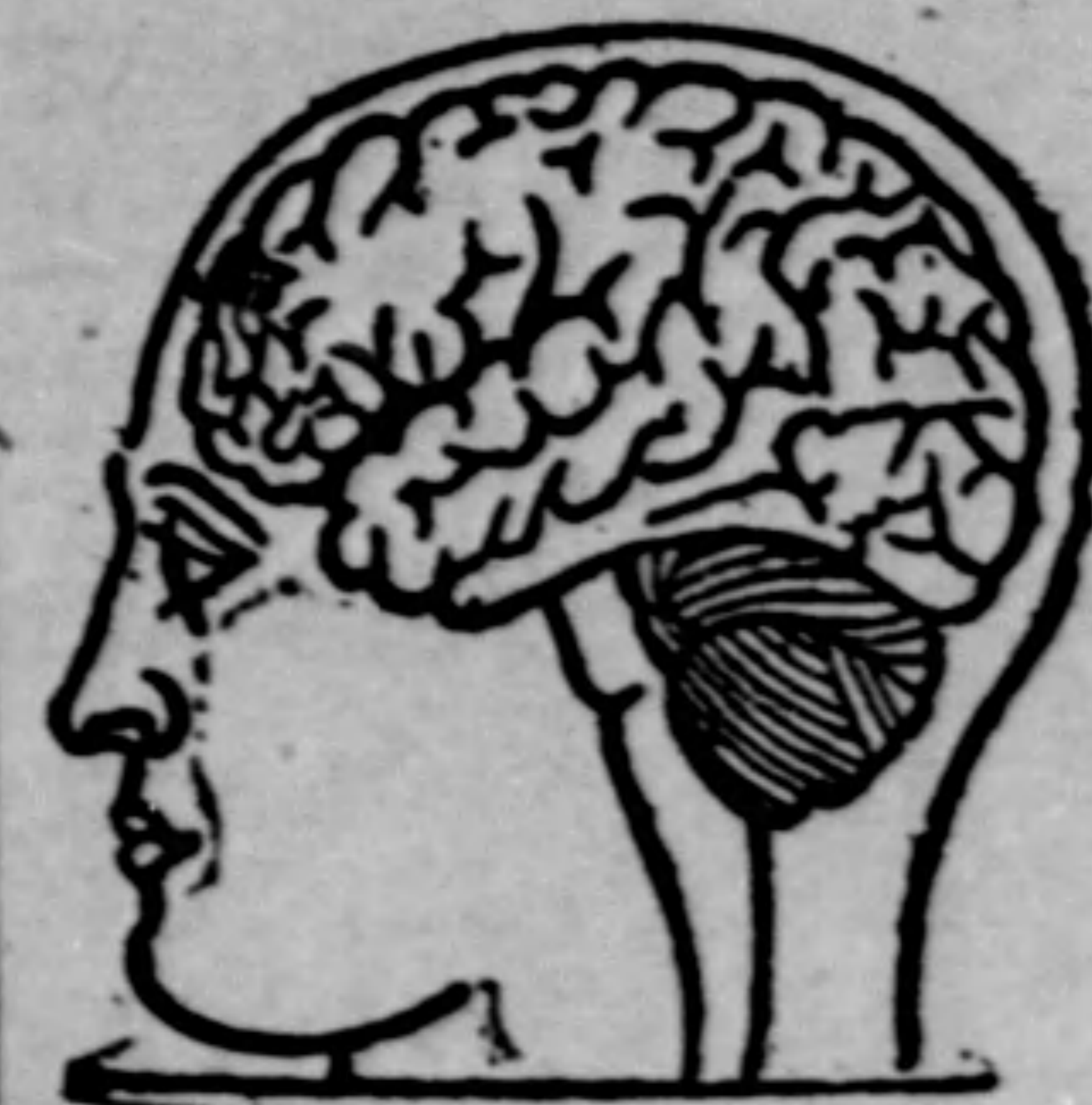
