County Council.

CONCLUSION.

In committee of the whole the report of the committee on Communications and Memorials was defeated by a vote of 31 to 20.

The special committee's report re treasurer's surpluses passed and the council went into committee on the various appointments by-laws. Mr. Lang in the chair.

The Warden named Mr. Robt. Edgar as his choice for Auditor, and the council proceeded to choose its man from a list of 13 nominees, Messrs. Burke, Jenkins, Campbell, Stephens, McKenny, Moffat, Atkey, Hare, Sproule, Wardell, Duigham, Albery and Brodie. After nearly a dozen ballots Mr. Jenkins was elected, Mr. Sproule coming second. The salary was fixed at \$40.

Messrs. Brown, Lang Gamey, Sing and Howe were nominated for the Board of Judicial audit and Mr. Brown was elected on the third ballot. For the outside member the nominees were Messrs. Cochran and Smelser, and Mr. Cochran received the appointment.

Mr. John Chisholm was appointed County director on the Board of the Toronto, Grey & Bruce Railway company.

Mr. Graham represented report No. 1 of the Railway Committee, recommended that the clerk correspond with the various county councils in the Province asking them to take into consideration at their June session the advisability of appointing a deputation to press the question of reduction in railway passenger fares before the Dominion House.—adopted.

The by-laws of the session were then put through their final stages, and a long discussion took place on Mr. Lang's By-law appointing commissioners to receive from the County Treasurer the money granted under by-law 473. Mr. Chisholm contended that the money should be paid over to the treasurer's of the local municipalities, while other members contended that the reeves having already been appointed commissioners to oversee the expenditure of the money should be fit and proper persons to draw the funds from the county, and deposit them with the township treasurers. The by-law was filled in most cases with the name of the reeve, and in one or two towns with that of the treasurer, and was carried in Council, a motion to lay it over being voted down; and also one by Mr. Stuart to substitute "reeves" for reeve as commissioners on the expenditure.

A motion by Messrs. Kerr and McGregor for the sending of an engineer to examine the Durham bridge and report next session, was lost.

A resolution by Messrs. Brown and Graham was also passed requiring the various reeves to submit a statement of their expenditure on bridges for the past year at the June session.

The Council adjourned till Monday, June 18th, at 7.30 p. m.
