Is there a woman—daughter, wife or mother—who is not desirous of having a stated allowance of money, no matter how small, over which she has absolute control? It is in the belief that there is not such an one that I have undertaken to discuss the subject, and in the hope—if it is not too presumptuous—that it may help to settle (if only in one home) this burning question.

1 It is more economical to allow a woman, say, a stated amount for household expenses every week, making it large enough to easily cover them and leave a margin which is to be hers for pin money, or if large enough for dress.

In such a case there will be an endeavor on the wife's part to make every dollar tell, there will be no little aimless spendings as she knows exactly what her limit is. It is more economical because it inculcates business habits and a disposition to keep accounts. She learns the value of money in the best possible way, i.e. by having it to spend and by having to reach certain results with a limited amount of money. To be without keeps her a child and makes her childishly reckless as to whether she can afford things or not. Especially as all her scrimping and saving makes no appreciable difference to her pocket; it is just as empty if she saves as if she doesn't; it is just as hard to get the necessary dollar as before.

2. There is something infinitely more pathetic than humorous in the stories told of women going through the pockets of their husbands looking for a stray dollar or two. What must be the biting necessity of a truly nice woman who must resort to such a method of obtaining spending money? Still the fact remains that a sensitive woman would rather steal from the aforesaid pockets, what her sense of justice tells her is her due, or do without the most necessary thing, than be a suppliant to her own husband, father or son.

Therefore I say that in the second place, being penniless puts a premium on duplicity, capery and all dissimulation which women notoriously practice upon men.

The daughter wheedles the father, the wife flatters and coaxes the husband so that he never can tell whether she means "Jack, I love you" or Jack, the front stairs need a new carpet." A proud woman will not stoop to these tactics, and she is the greatest sufferer. If men wish to be treated with sincerity by their women folk, they must put these matters on a more business-like basis.

3 It is a humiliation to a woman to have to ask for money, and the more she has done to earn it the more it galls her to ask for it. The possibility of a stern refusal, or of a degrading questioning as to how she means to spend it, fills her with impotent rage, and makes it an almost impossible thing for a woman to do.

There is no girl so happy as she with an occupation by which she is making her own way. No one need be consulted as to whether she needs new gloves, or whether she may indulge in some expensive little vagary for which she willingly pinches in other directions. It is this right to choose what she will have and what she will do without, which is so clear to a girl and which, reacting upon her character, forms habits of self-denial and self-control. Shall the wife be any less honorably treated? Does she not earn this right as truly in making a home, directing her household and managing carefully all her resources? Why the same thought and managing ability, which many a woman uses in her home, would command a large salary in other spheres of labor.

Many a man realizes this when the busy hands are suddenly stilled, and he finds that no money can hire the devotion to his interests which she hourly gave, perhaps without any recognition.

4. Woman is worthy of this trust. In a girl it makes for character as already shown. As for the mother, can any money requite her love? And if there be a man who cannot trust his wife to spend

wisely her little surplus, let me ask him does he never spend foolishly himself? He can be at least tolerably certain that she will not spend her little fund in liquor and tobacco. A woman's tastes are more esthetic than a man's. Her savings will generally take the form of a fund for the better furnishing of their home; for lessons in some branch of art which tends to culture; or for greater variety and beauty of dress for herself or children; or perhaps a handsome present for her husband at Christmas or on his birthday.

Anyone of these methods of expenditure benefits the husband as well as herself. And even though she should spend unwisely, she will not have a monopoly of all the foolishness that's going.

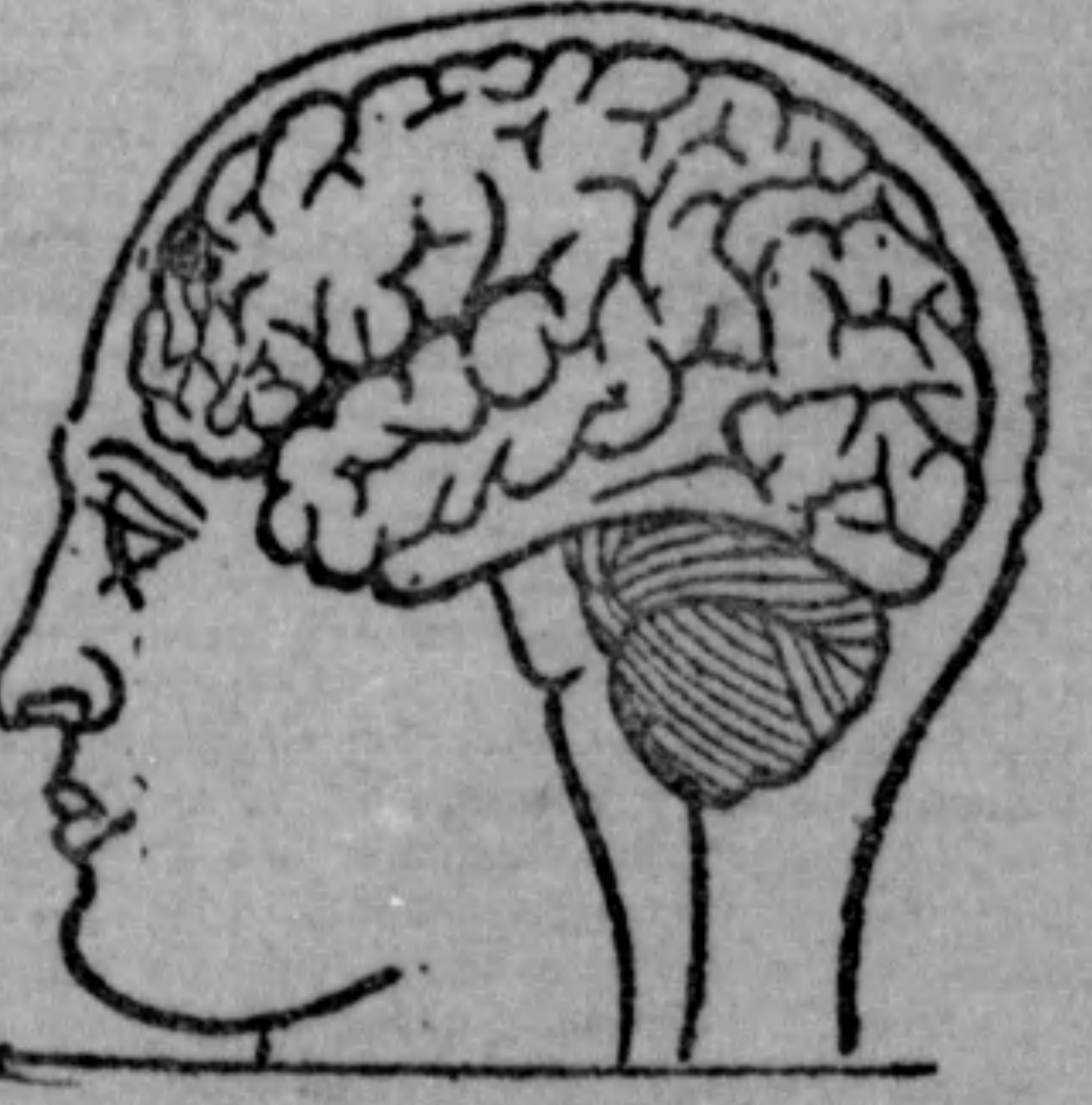
