Mr. Gamey at the Sound.

HE IS INTERVIEWED BY THE PLAIND DEALER—
PARDONABLE REJOICING.

Mr. Thomas Gamey, M. P. P., visited Owen Sound last week to recuperate after his exhaustive campaign, and here is what the Plaindealer says about the new member for Centre Grey:

Mr. Thomas Gamey, the Father of the County Council and now member-elect for Centre Grey, was a visitor to the Plaindealer sanctorum Wednesday afternoon. He is in splendid humor and pronounces the electorate of Centre Grey the most intelligent people on earth. His majority over his nearest competitor was only 542, and the vote went to him spontaneously and without any expenditure of money on his own part or on the part of others for him. But more than his triumphant election did a visit of some 1100 neighbors from his own and surrounding townships to his farm, near Maxwell, one evening last week please him. It was a tremendous gathering, the spokesmen for whom assured him that they had come to reassure him of the r appreciation of him as an old neighbor, as a worthy citizen, and man. It appears the tongue of scandal was freely used against Mr. Gamey during his campaign, though he is the Father of Grey-county council and has been honored for a generation by the people of Osprey, still he found himself proclaimed by "party" strikers to be "crooked as a ram's horn" and unworthy to be found outside of a reformatory institution. It tickled the member-elect almost to the point of lock-jaw to find that, after election, there was not the slightest truth in any of these campaign stories and that he was looked upon—as before election—as plain Farmer Thomas Gamey, whom some of the rising generation apply the endearing term of Santa Claus to. At one time, on the evening in question, Mr. Gamey feared he would have to borrow a farm or two along-side his own to accommodate the visitors with standing room, but his own broad acres sufficed to serve the purpose. A splendid evening was spent, some who had not voted for him joining the throng to certify to his estimable qualities as neighbor and public servant. There has been so much excitement down Osprey way since the election, Mr. Gamey, in order to find rest, sought this summer resort, is spending a few days with us, and recuperating nicely.

Asked about Patrons "going back," Mr. Gamey grew indignant, and demanded to know what a Patron had to do with either of the old parties. "The farmers," said Mr. Gamey, "will chop the head off a representative who plays false quicker than one can say 'Jack Robinson.' Independents mean business; they are not in politics as a pastime, and their interests are those of the people of the Dominion, as both old parties are bound to find out.
