## County and District.

Somebody sent a forged letter to the Clarksburg Reflector, and the publisher offers a reward of \$100 for the conviction of the offender.

Mr. Arch. Carnahan, sr., Meaford, is without a doubt the oldest orangeman in Canada. He was born in the year 1805 in the County of Cavan, Ireland, and was initiated in Lisbols Orange Lodge, No. 577, in 1823, and has maintained an unbroken connection with the order ever since. Mr. Carnahan has therefore been a member of the order for 71 years.

An exchange tells of a man who went into a store and asked if he could rest four or five hours. The proprietor, who has just found a nest of new born mice in the coffee grinder, told him he could, and then asked why he did not go to a hotel. It is seldom we hear of any person being bitten by a snake in this part of the province, but we have a case of that kind to chronicle this week. On Monday Mr. Joseph Denison was going through a swale, near Strathaven, and stepped upon the tail of a snake, when it turned and struck him on the instep, he having on low shoes at the time. The snake must have been of a venomous nature as Mr. Denison's foot immediately began to swell and although he procured medical aid as quickly as possible the swelling increased and when he came out to his place Monday evening to procure some drugs he was suffering so much from pain and the swelling had increased so such an extent that he was obliged to again seek the aid of a doctor for relief.—Chatsworth News.

Wednesday morning of last week a very serious accident happened on Mr. James Cherry's farm on the 6th of Peel. It seems he was just loading his first load of hay in the field and attached to the wagon was a span of colts. Mr. Cherry had a little boy and his daughter helping him. When the lead was about half on, the colts began to be frightened and made a jump. Miss Cherry, who was on the wagon, was thrown off and in falling got her ankle joint so badly broken and dislocated that the foot was turned up sideways and the end of both bones protruded through the flesh a considerable length. Mr. Cherry, in endeavoring to catch the horses, was struck on the right side, breaking two ribs and receiving severe internal injuries, the extent of which is not at present known, but he is in a very bad condition. It will be at least three or four weeks before he will be able to do anything, and in the case of his daughter as many months.—Mt. Forest Rep.

The serious result of swallowing a cherry pit was fully demonstrated in the case of Minnie, the 16-year-old son of Samuel Gamble, of Normanby, on Monday. Dr. Reynolds, assisted by Dr. Jones and Dr. Howitt, of Guelph, on that day performed an operation on the young man to relieve him of obstruction of the bowels. On opening the bowel a cherry pit was found lodged in the appendix of that organ; a large cupful of pus was also removed and as mortification had set in, over an inch of the appendix was cut out. This very serious operation was the last resort of medical science in order to save the young man's life and it is a pleasure to know that it is likely to be crowned with success, as on the day following (Tuesday) the patient was doing nicely. We hope our readers will make a note of this case and fully realize the danger there is in the swallowing of any kind of fruit pits or seeds.—Mt. F. Rep.
