Fall Assizes.

The Fall Assizes for the County of Grey opened in the Court House here at 2 p. m. Monday, 10th inst., before the Honorable Mr. Justice Rose. There were five civil and two criminal cases to be disposed of. Several of the civil cases were settled out of Court, and in consequence this sittings of Assizes bids fair to be comparatively short. The civil cases on the list were the following:

Lang vs. Smith and Peake. This was a replevin action brought by Dr. Lang of Owen Sound against Frederick Snell and Oliver Peake, two Toronto men, to recover possession of two race horses and the trappings belonging to them. The defence set up was an account of keep and training of the horses, and a consequent trainer's lien. Judgment for plaintiff with costs. Defendant's counterclaim dismissed with costs. MacKay & Hatton for Plff.; Murdoch & Lytle (Toronto) for Defts.

Carmichael vs. McNab.—This was an action for seduction. The parties reside in Sydenham. A settlement was arrived at between the parties to the suit, and the case was struck off the list. H. G. Tucker for Plff.; MacKay & Hatton for Deft.

Canna vs. Morrison.—This was also an action for seduction, and the parties also reside in Sydenham. By arrangement between the parties the suit was withdrawn from the list, and no evidence was taken. John Armstrong for the Plff.; McKay & Hatton for Deft.

Gillies vs. Dow.—Action for seduction. The parties reside near Flesherton. This case occupied the attention of the court for about three hours on Monday, the Jury not having agreed when the court rose. A sealed verdict was brought in this morning awarding the plaintiff \$5 damages. J. W. Frost for Plff.; Lucas and Wright for Deft.

McNabb vs. Wood.—This was an action brought by Mrs. J. D. McNabb against Miss Louisa Wood, who, it will be remembered was the prosecutrix against McNabb in the criminal case some weeks ago. The action was for the recovery by the plaintiff of damages consequent upon the illicit relations between Mr. McNabb and Miss Wood. Verdict for defendant. McKay & Hatton for Plff.; H. G. Tucker for defendant.

This concluded the civil business. There are two criminal cases on the list: Queen vs. Weed, conspiracy; and Queen vs. Miller, highway robbery; in which true bills have been found.

Queen vs. Weed.—Charge of conspiracy to keep a witness from attending court and giving evidence. Verdict, "Guilty."

Prisoner was allowed to go on suspended sentence. Queen vs. Miller.—Trial postponed until December Sessions owing to absence of a Crown witness.—Advertiser.

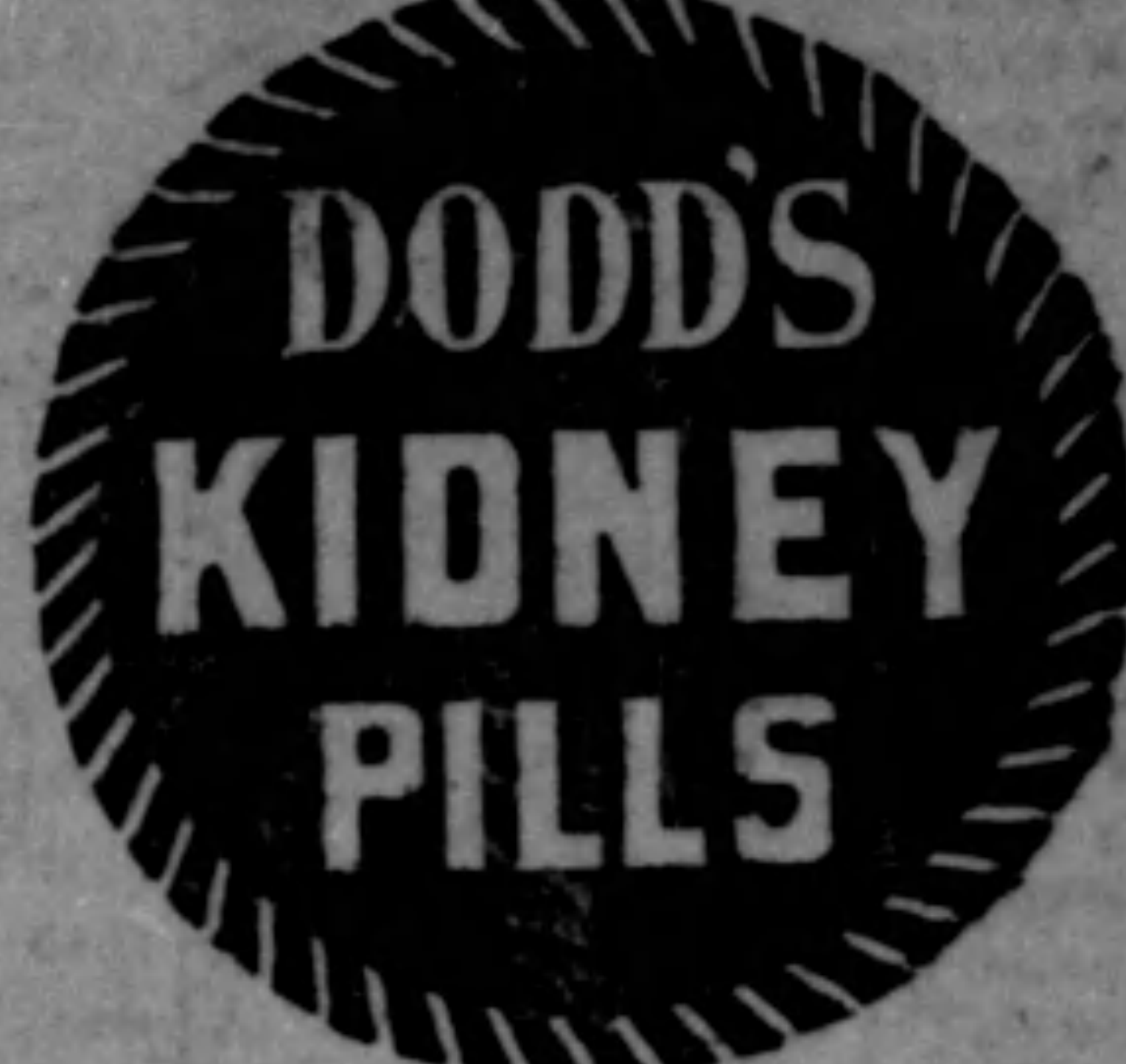
