### General News of the Hour.

Tuberculosis is said to be very prevalent among cattle on Vancouver Island, B. C. Owing to lack of money about 500 officers of the police department of Chicago are to be discharged.

Mr. Levi P. Morton, Governor-elect of New York state, spent \$19,790 in the election, according to a statement filed by his private secretary.

The jury in the Westwood case returned a verdict Monday night that Frank Westwood came to his death from a bullet fired by an unknown person.

Michael Cavanagh, a laborer who has been working in Windsor, Ont., has fallen heir to a \$30,000 fortune in Galt. Chief of Police Willis, of Windsor, loaned him money enough to get to Galt.

The United States Government Committee's report on the great railroad strike has been made public at Chicago. The commissioners blame the Manager's Association as well as the A. R. U., and endorse the calling out of the federal troops to quell the disorder.

To build a railway from Quebec westerly to Norway House, thence across the Rocky Mountains to the Pacific coast, with a branch from a point west of Lake Winnipeg to Hudson Bay, is the gigantic scheme of a company now seeking incorporation.

Hon. G. E. Foster and Sir Donald Smith were passengers by the Campania, which arrived at New York on Saturday.

At the Toronto Court of Revision Saturday the Confederation Life Insurance Company asked for reduction on their assessment of \$155,000 on income. Instead of reducing the assessment the court increased it to \$174,000.

On Friday night Judge Ferguson boarded a G. T. R. train at Napanee for Toronto. At Kingston a change of conductors was made, and the judge, by some mistake or misunderstanding was called on for a ticket or fare. He refused to pay a second time and at Trenton the judge was ordered to leave the train. The judge stayed in Trenton all night and when he reached Toronto next day refused to listen to the railway officials, who wanted to explain matters.
