East Grey Conservatives.

A MOST ENTHUSIASTIC MEETING AT MARKDALE.

The regular annual meeting of East Grey Conservatives was held in Haskett's hall, Markdale, on Friday last, and the crowd which gathered there was something to gladden the hearts of old-timers. It was said to be the most enthusiastic, representative, harmonious, and unanimous annual meeting held in ten years past. The resolutions put to the meeting were carried without a dissentient voice. A few old faces were conspicuous by their absence, but many new ones more than made up for the deficiency. President Kells occupied the chair, and in a short opening address said he thought it would perhaps be better to put someone else in his place, but this the meeting would not hear to. The auditors' report, showing a deficiency of \$3.56, was adopted, after which the election of officers took place and resulted as follows:

Douglas; Shelburne, John Jelly. Auditors—W. A. Brown, James Elliott.

The following resolutions were then put to the meeting and carried unanimously:

"The members of the East Riding of Grey Liberal Conservative Association, at this their annual meeting, desire to place on record their deep regret that in the formation of the cabinet of Hon. Mackenzie Bowell, the claims of their esteemed member, Dr. Sproule, for a position therein were not recognized. From his long and faithful service to the conservative party, his splendid capacity for public duties and his ability as a debater, we respectfully ask the premier when considering the next change in the cabinet to give Dr. Sproule that position to which he is justly entitled. We feel satisfied he will prove a worthy representative of North-western Ontario. And that a copy of this resolution be submitted to the premier."

This association desires to express its deep sympathy with Lady Thompson in the sad blow which has lately fallen upon her by the hand of the grim reaper, death. While deploring the sad and sudden demise of the late premier, we desire also to again place on record our high estimate of his abilities and qualification for the high and honorable position which he has held, and to express our appreciation of the great services he has rendered, not alone to our Dominion but to the empire.

That this association express their confidence in Hon. Mackenzie Bowell, Premier of Canada, and his administration; and assure him of our hearty support.

They also have much pleasure in renewing their confidence in Dr. Sproule, who for the past sixteen years, has so ably and faithfully represented East Grey in the House of Commons.

Dr. Sproule was called upon and gave a rattling good speech, during which he arraigned Mr. McCarthy as a malcontent and charged him with collusion with the Reform party, giving as evidence his votes during last session. He also said Mr. McCarthy suborned his own interests before those of the party and was seldom to be found in his place. The Dr. spoke at considerable length on other political topics. Other speakers who followed with short addresses were Major Rorke, ex-M. P. P., Neil McColman, Esq., and John Lyons, Esq. Dr. Sproule, as is his usual custom, treated the delegates to a supper at the Markdale House.
