Since last issue of The Advance the school question has taken another turn. The Manitoba Legislature has adjourned until May 9 without discussing the question in any form. The Dominion parliament meets on the 18th inst., but it is all together unlikely that it will do anything in the premises until Manitoba is fully heard from one way or the other.

Things are going along quietly down at the Legislature in Toronto these days. Since the Patron rebuffs two weeks ago on the doctors' bill and appointment of county officials there has been a summer calm during which business has been rushed off so expeditiously that adjournment is expected to take place in less than two weeks.

Township Council.

The Council of the township of Artemesia met in the Town Hall, Flesherton, on Monday, April 1st, 1895. Members present, the reeve, Messrs. Thompson, Best, McMillan and Kells. Minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed. Communications as follows were presented and read: D. McCormick asking to be relieved as overseer in Priceville; R. H. Meddowh, re township lot in Priceville; John O'Hernan, waited upon Council re deviation at Irish Lake; Ward Harrison waited upon Council re south line; Robt. Campbell waited upon the Council as to changing boundaries of S. S. Nos. 11 and 13 by having lots 22 and 23, con. 8, and lot 24, con. 11 and 12, removed from S. S. No. 11 and placed in S. S. No. 13; Harry Weber waited his statute labor charged in road div. No. 74 instead of in valley road; a petition from Miss Hickling and other ladies of ward No. 4, re bylaw as to stock running at large. The following changes were made in bylaw appointing overseers, instead of those previously appointed, viz: Herbert Purvis, C. Hales, R. Watters, T. Butler, Jas. Magee, Richard Douglas, Geo. Hutchison, John McFadyen. Bylaw 514, appointing Dr. Hutton medical health officer, was introduced and passed. W. J. Lever gave notice of withdrawal of lots 134 and 135, 3 N.E., from S. S. No. 11 and have the same placed in S. S. No. 2.

Kells—Best—That bylaw No. 513, appointing pathmasters, fenceviewers and poundkeepers, as amended, be read a third time, finally passed, signed by the reeve and filed. Carried.

Kells—McMillan—That bylaw 514, to appoint medical health officer for the township of Artemesia, be read a third time, finally passed, signed by the reeve and engrossed in bylaw book. Carried.

Thompson—McMillan—That a grant of \$4 extra be made to Wm. Falls, indigent, to enable him to procure some clothing and other necessities for the months of April and May. Carried.

Thompson—Best—That John O'Hernan be paid \$50 on account of deviation on lot 28, con. 7, Glenelg, being the township between Artemesia and Glenelg, and that upon certificate from the Council of Glenelg the reeve is hereby authorized to issue order for balance. Carried.

McMillan—Kells—That the following bills be paid: John Boland, one day at Proton Station, \$2, going to Owen Sound, re Graham suit, \$2, travelling expenses, \$1.75, one telegram, 30c, total \$6.05; Thos. Kells, one day at Proton Station, \$2; James Best, half day at Proton Station, \$1, James Best to Dundalk, \$2, livery hire, one horse, \$1, total \$4; Geo. Thompson, one day to Proton Station, \$2. Carried.

Kells—Best—That the Clerk and Mr. McMillan examine what is known as the McArthur property in Priceville now owned by this township; with the view of selling the same. Carried.

Kells—McMillan—That the petition of Miss Abby Hickling, and other ladies of ward No. 4, re animals running at large, be left over for future consideration as none of the lady petitioners are present. Carried.

McMillan—Kells—That pathmasters be and are hereby notified to expend all moneys entrusted to them for road improvements by calling for tenders or by public competition. Carried.

Thompson—Best—That the applications of W. J. Lever and Robert Campbell be

received and that the clerk be authorized and is hereby authorized to notify the trustees of the S. S. interested. Carried.

Kells—McMillan—That the auditor's report for 1894 as finally audited, be accepted and 100 copies be printed in pamphlet form for distribution. Reeve to see that no excessive charge be made for printing. Carried.

Thompson—Kells—That the following councillors be commissioned and shall have supervision of the roads and bridges of this township for the year 1895 in their several wards as follows: Ward No. 1, Donald McMillan; Ward No. 2, Thos. Kells; Ward No. 3, James Best; Ward No. 4, George Thompson. Carried.

Kells—Thompson—That whereas this council has been sued by one John J. Brown for \$30, the said \$30 being claimed by the said John J. Brown as damages sustained by having his cutter damaged at or near Proton Station and whereas this council are strongly of the opinion that we have no right to pay said claim, therefore, be it resolved that this council defend the suit and that the reeve be and is hereby requested to go to Owen Sound to consult Solicitor McKay and to make such necessary arrangements for the defence as he considers proper and that R. and A. Nelson be included for the defence. Carried.

Thompson—Kells—That all parties are hereby notified to remove forthwith all logs and other obstructions placed upon the public roads in this corporation and all persons are hereby strictly forbidden to place any kind of obstructions upon any of the said public highways within this municipality. All persons who have placed or are in the habit of placing obstructions upon said highways are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly by this. Carried.
Council adjourned to 30th April, 1895.
