Artemesia Council. Artemesia Council met as a court of revision on Monday and put in one of the heaviest day's work that it has done in the past fifteen years. It was 12 p.m. before the business was all completed. There was a large number of appeals which were disposed of as follows: John Buchanan, lot pt. 31, con. 10, overcharge on land. Assessment reduced \$100. John Duncan, lots 168-169, 3 S.W., overcharge on land, was next called. The assessment was sustained. Peter Dow, lots 32, 33, 34, 1 N.D.E., overcharge on land. The assessment was reduced \$150. R. J. Sproule, agent for M. McCarthy, appealed against the assessment of lot 16, Latimer's survey, as being overcharged. The roll was sustained. J. H. Lever appealed against assessment of lots Nos. 128-129, 2 N.E., as being too high. The roll was sustained. Hector Kennedy, lot 30, con. 8, overcharge on land, was next called. The assessment was reduced \$50. Isaac Smith, lot 29 and w. 1-2 30, overcharge on land. The assessment was sustained. James Maxwell, lot 85, con. 4, overcharge on land. The assessment was reduced \$100. Dr. Christie to have lot No. 177, 2 N.E., placed on resident roll to Robert T. White and the assessment is too high. Appeal granted. Property assessed at \$500. Dr. Christie, that lots 64 to 63, con. 2, N. D. R., overcharged. Assessment was reduced \$100. C. Watson, lots 37-38, con. 2, S.D.R., acreage to be corrected to 134 acres instead of 74, as appears on roll. Request granted. Ed. Cullis, overcharge on land. Assessment was reduced \$100. Geo. Radley was assessed as tenant and Josiah Gamey as owner for pt. 37, con. 7, five acres at a valuation of \$25. The court adjourned.

The council in ordinary session then transacted the following business: Communications were read from police trustees of Flesherton re collection of rates, also from reeve and clerk of Proton re grant of \$150 on townline, asking supplemental grant from Artemesia. Petitions were received from Jas. Fisher and others, re removal of fences on sideroad 160; from Alex. Taylor and others re culvert opposite lot 186; from Thorp Wright and others, asking council to do away with the ward system, also to devise some different way of spending the public money. Accounts were received from Mrs. Thompson, bread for Mrs. Hanley, \$5.10; from W. H. Thurston, printing, postage and advertising, \$5.33; from W. J. Bellamy, preparing deed and postage, \$4.85. Kells-Thompson-That re the application of Mr. Wright for the opening of certain ditches in front of lots 187 to 190, con. 2 west, the reeve and Commissioner Best be and are hereby appointed a committee to examine and report on this matter at next meeting of council. Carried. Best-McMillan-That the sum of \$9 be paid Arch. Cairns in full of 45 rods of ditch dug on 140 side road, being half the amount of total cost. Carried. McMillan-Thompson-That the petition of Thorp Wright and eighty others, asking that the ward system be abolished, be left over until next regular meeting of council. Carried. Thompson-Kells-That this council grant \$15 to be supplemented by \$15 by com. of ward 4 out of his appropriation, said amount to be expended in improving 30th side road between con. 13 and 14. Carried. Kells-Thompson-That \$15 be granted to be expended in opening up 120 side road, 3 S. W., and con. No. 2 expend \$5 out of his appropriation in same place for same purpose. Carried. Kells-McMillan-That the petition of Alex. Taylor, re culvert, be referred to commissioners of wards 3 and 4 to do as they may deem best in the matter. Carried. Best-Thompson-That the petition of James Fisher and nineteen others in regard to having the fences on 160 side road removed be left over until next meeting of this council. Carried. Thompson-Kells-That the treasurer is hereby authorized to pay orders of the police trustees of Flesherton to the amount of \$125 for the present. Carried. McMillan-Thompson-That W. J. Bellamy be paid for preparing deed re McArthur property, \$2; and to postage to 1st June, 1895, \$2.85; also that Mrs. Hanley's bread account with Mrs. Thompson, \$5.10 be paid. Carried. Best-McMillan-That the bill of W. H. Thurston for the following accounts be paid: 300 road com. orders, limp, \$2; postage \$8; advt. court of revision, \$2; 500 motion blanks, \$1.25, total \$5.33. Carried. Thompson-Best-That the communication of Proton council regarding a grant

of \$150 on townline Proton and Artemesia, be left over with a view of having the reeve communicate with the reeve of Proton regarding the matter. Carried. Thompson-McMillan-That the commissioners be paid their commission on ward appropriation 1895 as follows: ward 1, \$16; ward 2, \$16; ward 3, \$20; ward 4, \$16; and that the reeve issue his order for payment. Carried. Kells-Best-That the assessor be paid \$5, the usual amount of postage. Carried. Best-Thompson-That Messrs. Kells and McMillan are authorized to attend the division court at Dundalk in behalf of this council in the suit of Brown vs. Artemesia and Proton. Carried. McMillan-Best-That the roll as now revised by this court of revision be the roll for all purposes for the year 1895. Carried. Council adjourned until 29th June, 1895

McArdle-Wilson-The council receive their pay \$4 each and Joseph McArdle 30 cents for postage. McArdle-Mackenzie-John Batchelor be paid \$1 for repairing culvert, Adam Bryce \$1.50 for repairing bridges in Div. No. 2. Watson-Wilson-The bill of John Rutherford be paid for assessment and collector's rolls, etc., \$14.45. The clerk \$40, part 2nd quarter's salary. McArdle-Wilson-Thos. Watson be paid \$19.75 for filling washout by Maitland river on con. 9. Watson-Wilson-The bill of H. E. Glendenning for printing auditors' reports and stationery, \$18.24, be paid. McArdle-Wilson-John Dezall be paid \$22.50 for road job in Div. 2. McArdle-Mackenzie-Patrick Mulhall be changed from separate school No. 6 to public school No. 14 at his own request. Watson-Wilson-All lots in 18 and 19 con., east of lot 23, be formed in the new road beat with John Hodgins as pathmaster, the clerk to furnish with list of statute labor for said beat. McKenzie-Wilson-Thos. McAuley, assessor, be paid \$55 for salary and \$5 for postage. Watson-McKenzie-The court of revision resume business and assessment roll, as now finally revised, be the assessment roll for the township of Proton for the year 1895. 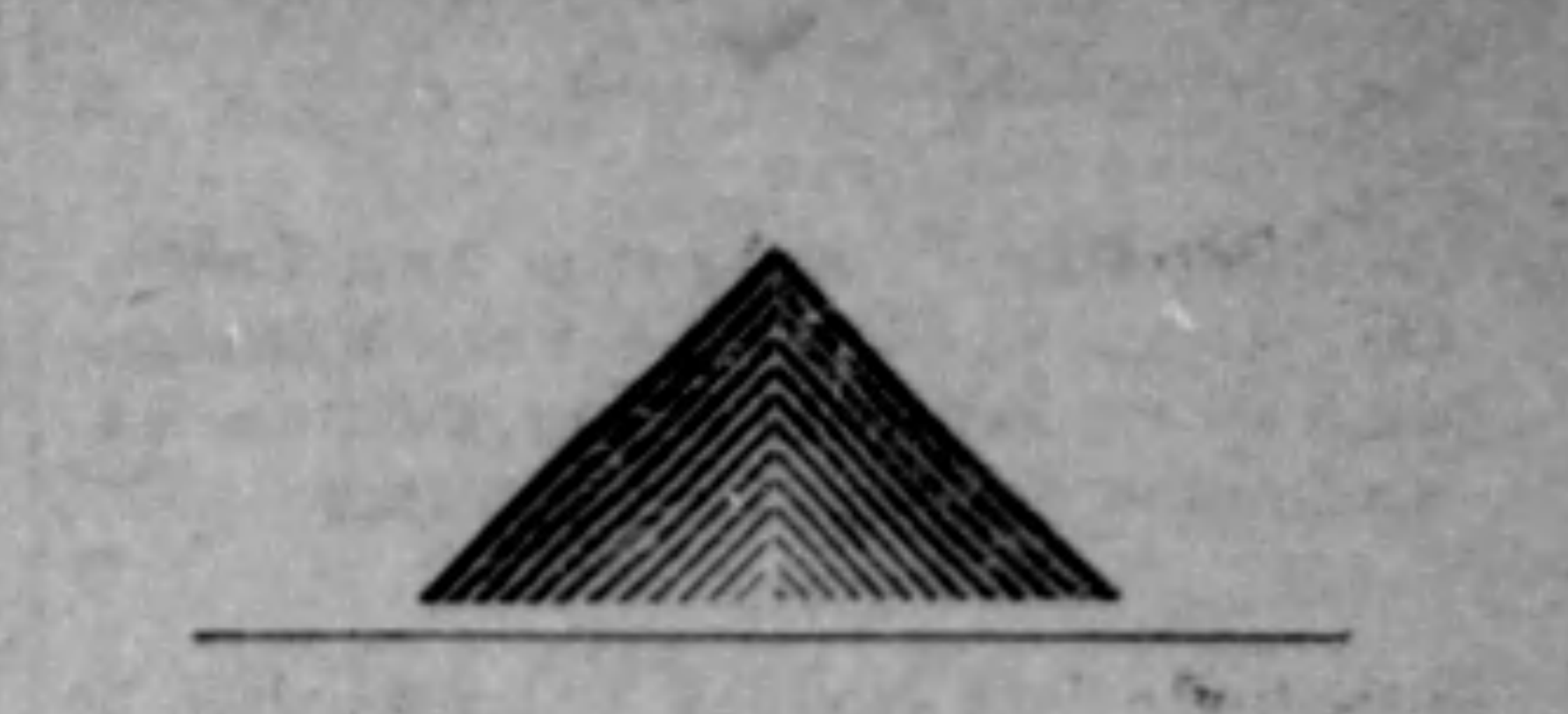

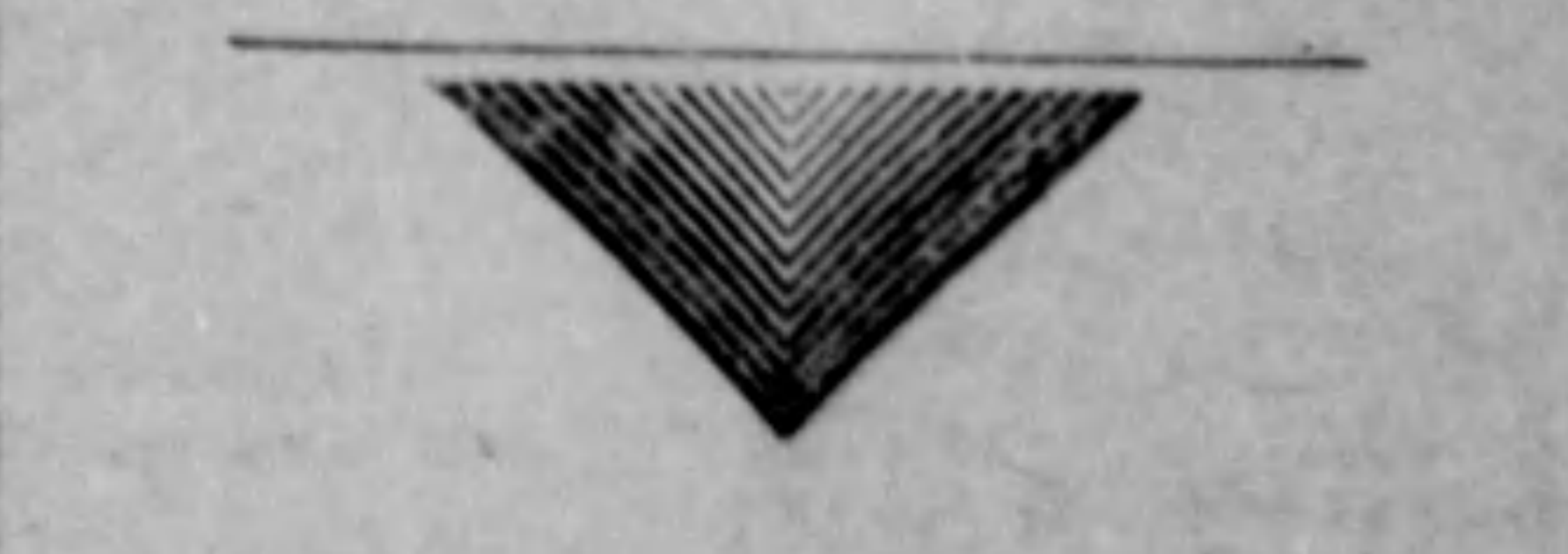
