Winter Wheats.

One hundred and twenty-two varieties of winter wheat have been tested at the Ontario Agriculture College within the past six years. Some of these varieties have produced yields of grain which were more than double those of other varieties grown beside them on plots of the same area. In the fall of 1894, nine leading varieties of winter wheat were selected from the kinds, which had been grown from one to five years at the Agricultural College and were distributed throughout Ontario for co-operative experimental work. These were divided into two sets, with five varieties in each, the Dawson's Golden Chaff being used in both sets to form a basis by which the results of all the varieties could be compared with one another.

The following table gives the comparative yields of straw and grain per acre of the winter wheat varieties tested during the past season on one hundred Ontario farms:

As none except the one hundred good reports of successfully conducted experiments have been used in the preceding summary of results, they should be of great value and worthy of the thoughtful attention of wheat growers in Ontario.

DISTRIBUTION OF SEED.

In the following table will be found two sets of winter varieties, which will be sent free, by mail, in half-pound lots of each variety, to farmers applying for them, who will carefully test the five kinds in the set which they choose, and will report the results after harvest next year. The seed will be sent out in the order in which the applications are received as long as the supply lasts.

SET 1.—Dawson's Golden Chaff, Early Red Clawson, Jones' Winter Fife, Surprise, American Bronze.

SET 2.—Dawson's Golden Chaff, Early Genesee Giant, Pride of Genesee, Bulgarian, Jones' Square Head.

Each person wishing one of these sets should write to the Experimentalist, Agricultural College, Guelph, mentioning which set he desires; and the grain, with instructions for testing, and blank form on which to report, will be furnished free of cost to his address, until the supply of grain for distributing becomes exhausted.

No. 4 Grey Fall Exhibition.

This year's fall show on the pleasure grounds at Owen Sound, Sept. 16, 17, 18 and 19 promises to far surpass the great exhibition held last year. The program, which appears in another column, shows that the directors have secured the very best attractions. Cyrene, the character and acrobatic dancer and slack wire artiste, has a world-wide reputation. La Belle Bros. in the Mexican revolving ladder, double trapeze, etc., will certainly prove a drawing card. The Graham Bros. are also billed. The high stilt walking clown and contortionist is well known in parts of Grey.

\$2,500 cash are offered in prizes. Two large cattle sheds have been built. A large tent, formerly owned by the Woodbridge Poultry Association, will contain the poultry exhibit. Accommodation, 8x100 feet, will be furnished for machinery. Day and night fire works will enliven the proceedings. A large aquarium will contain ten different kinds of fish. The speeding in the ring and bicycle races on the splendid half-mile track will assist in drawing one of the largest crowds ever gathered in Owen Sound.

Denmark's Good Butter.

In a recent address Mr. Vander Heyde, a Belgian expert, drew attention to the increasing prosperity of Denmark in the production of butter. The Danes have had next to monopoly of the English market, while taking at the same time the top prices. This is not exact, since France holds the record in that respect for their basket butters. His own country—Belgium—once occupied high butter rank in the British market, but lost that position solely from negligence in the preparation of the butter, and also to adulteration. The Denmark butter—thanks to vigilant inspection—is wholly free from these drawbacks. Between 1886 and 1892 the export of Danish butter to England alone augmented 1,400

per cent. There are 2,400 dairies in Denmark, of which 1,000 are owned by individual farmers; the remainder are co-operative creameries, working up the milk furnished by small cultivators, whose joint efforts secure the most improved apparatus and scientific processes, while obtaining uniformity of brand. There is a lesson here for Canadian butter producers. They must produce the best brand if they want to get the British market in competition with the Danes, and to attain this result they must co-operate to have their butter made and marketed in prime condition.

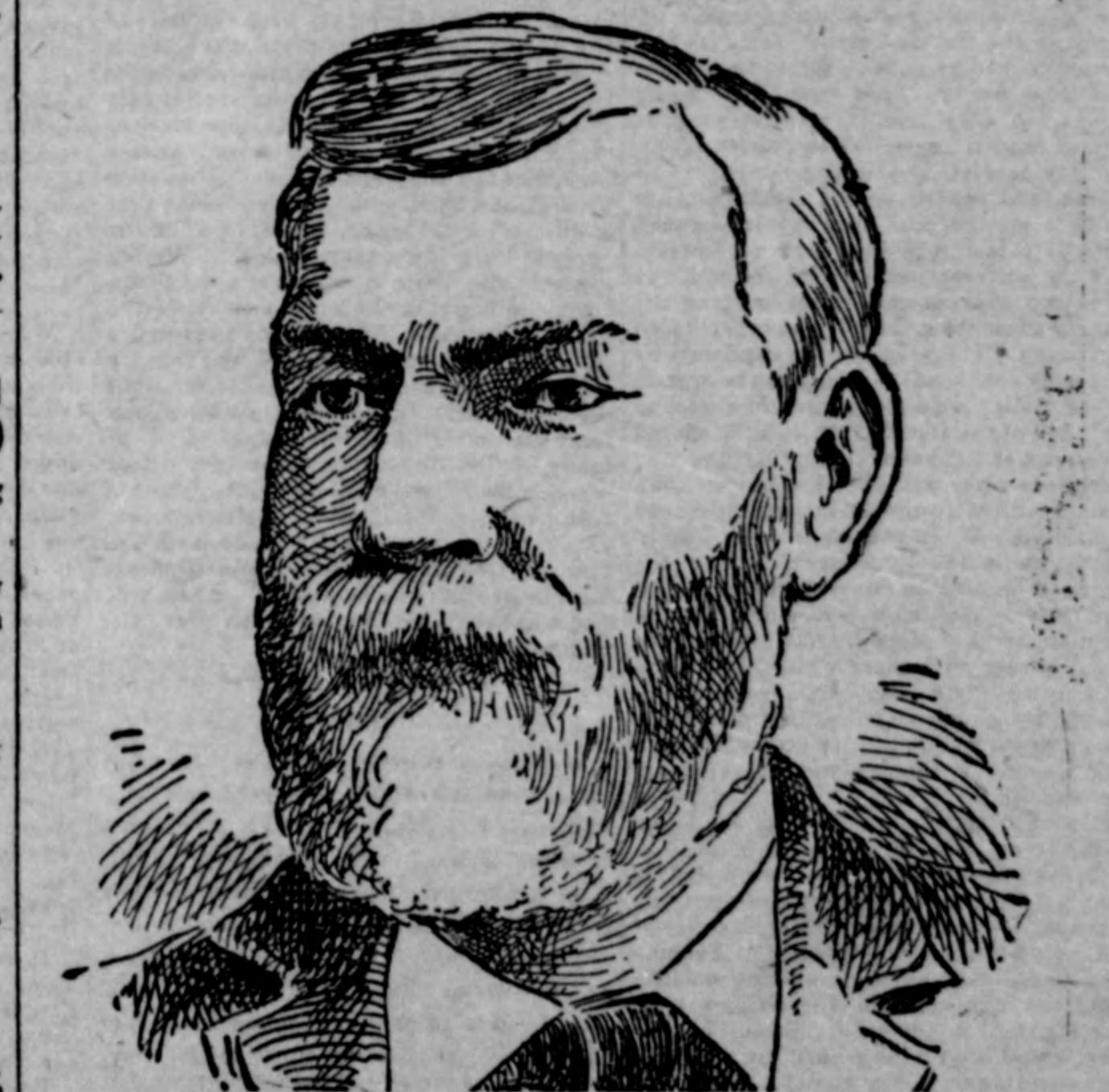
