Osprey Council

The council of Osprey met at Maxwell on Dec. 15th last. The members all present. The minutes of last meeting were read and signed by the Reeve. Communications were read from H. E. Glendinning, bill \$4, printing and stationery; Petition from D. K. Preston and others, asking for exemption of taxes to Geo. Pallister, on account of loss by fire. Report of special committee appointed to examine and report on townline Artemesia and Osprey, north of 12th con.; James Armour, pathmaster, certifying that Oliver Kyle and Fred Hawkins performed the statute labor charged against them; from the treasurer, statement of receipts and expenditure from January 1st to date.

Clark—Guy—That George Pallister be exempted the taxes on lot east half 8, con. 6, and lot sp. 7, con. 7, for 1898, on account of his loss by fire.

Orders were issued on the Treasurer to pay A. G. Campbell \$2, H. E. Glendinning \$4, Dr. Scott \$3, Hy. Heitman \$2, Neil McLean 2, Robert Weir \$1, Thos. Scott \$1, use of hall for council meetings; Josiah Gamey \$2.25, discount on chiques; Chas. Finlay, 50 cts.; work on townline Artemesia and Osprey; Jno. A. Kernaghan \$25, being grant made to Osprey Agricultural Society; Wm. Monaghan \$3; Samuel Taylor \$3, for selecting jurors; Ambrose Saigeon \$75, for shortening span and filling in abutments and approach to bridge over Mad river, con. 4; Wm. J. Monaghan \$7, attending tax sale, Owen Sound; Wm. J. Monaghan \$2, W. H. Guy \$2, John Clark \$2, service on committee examining and reporting on townline Artemesia and Osprey; Thos. Scott \$2, assisting treasurer to prepare December 15th statement.

Clark—Morrison—That the clerk notify the council of Melancton township of an expenditure of \$8, made by Osprey on the townline and ask them to remit \$4, being half the amount.

Speers—Guy—That the taxes of P. Ottewell on lot pt. 9, con. 12, amounting to \$1.78, be exempted, he being in indigent circumstances.

Guy—Morrison—That the taxes of Chas. Stewart on lot 45-46, con. 3, N. D. R., amounting to \$3.24, be exempted, he being in indigent circumstances.

Guy—Morrison—That the collector receive the taxes of E. Lineley, lot 2, con. 14, less \$2, charged as statute labor and now performed.

Clark—Morrison—That the collector receive the taxes of Enoch Scilley, lot 35, con. 3, N. D. R., less \$5, charged as statute labor and now performed.

Clark—Guy—That the collector receive the taxes of Oliver Kyle, lots 75-76, con. 1, N. D. R., less \$6.00, and of Fred Hawkins, lots 79-80, con. 1, N. D. R., less \$4.00, charged as statute labor and now performed.

By Laws Nos. 369 and 370, to pay township officers and appoint Deputy Returning officers and fix polling-places, were read the necessary number of times and passed.
