The famous arbitration suit of Jos. Pattullo against the town of Orangeville has reached its final award at last, and the finding is a bad knockout for the legal talent of Orangeville. The award handed down by Judge McCarthy gave damages to Pattullo, but he was ordered to pay half the costs. From this award he appealed, and on the 9th instant Justice Armour varied Judge McCarthy's award by ordering the town to pay all costs of arbitration and costs of appeal. The amount of damage done to Pattullo's building was not much over \$50, but the town is richer in legal advice than in liberality and refused payment. The consequence is a bill of costs amounting to possibly \$400.
