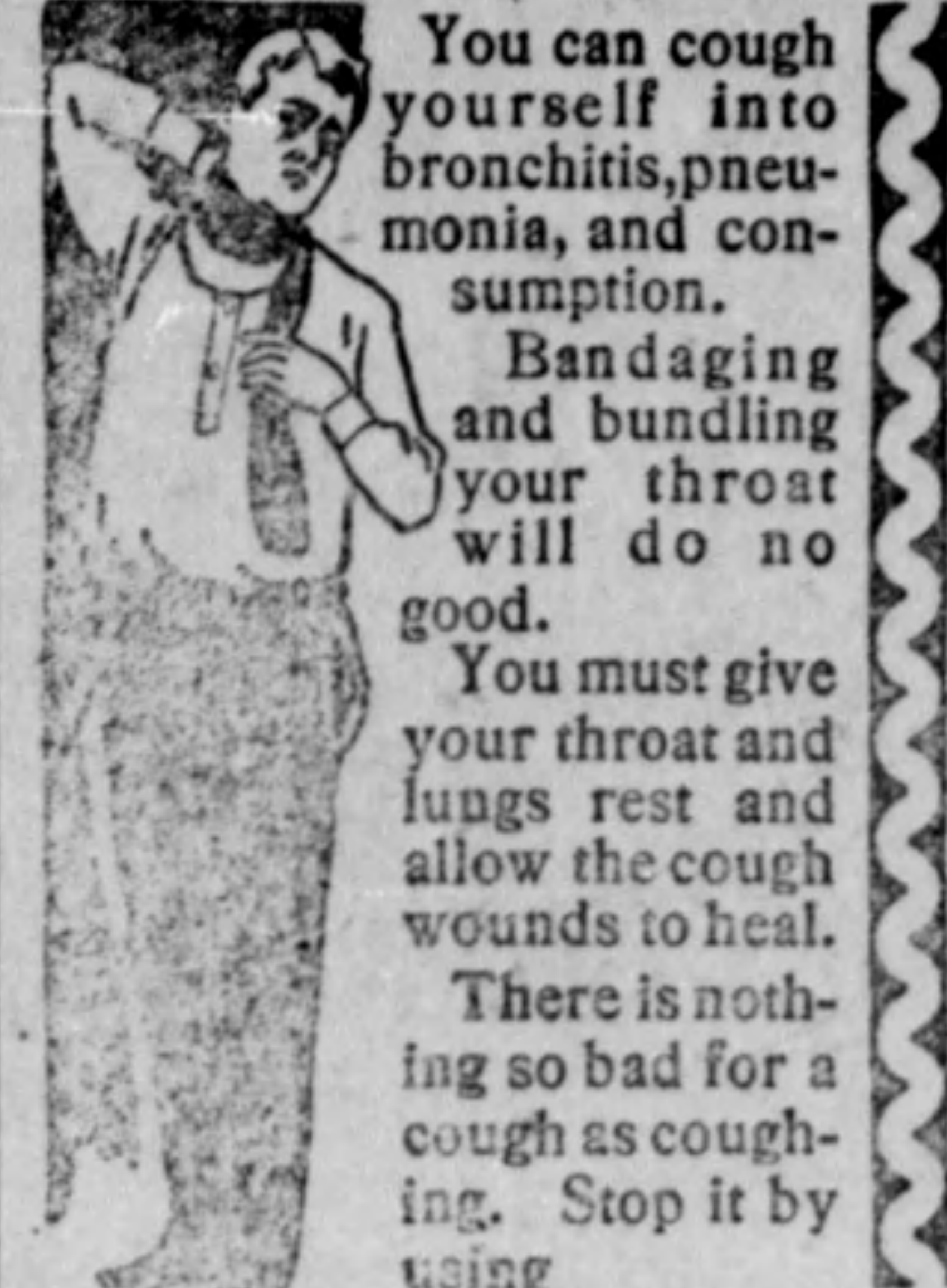

Henry W. Morton, of Walters Falls, was held up on the Grand Trunk tracks near Strachan avenue, Toronto, one night last week by six or seven men who, after kicking and abusing him, stole \$52 from his pockets.

The largest loaded freight train that ever reached this point came in on Saturday morning over the C. P. R. The train comprised 45 box cars, all heavily loaded. Conductor Imro brought in the train and the time made was almost as good as that made by trains of the ordinary size. The tonnage was very large. The entire train carried 1,185 tons of general merchandise, or enough to load any one of the C. P. R. steamships. This is unprecedented, three trains at least being required usually to bring in sufficient tonnage for one cargo. The C. P. R., owing to the withdrawal of so many engines to the west, has resorted to heavier trains for the engines left on this route. The big train Saturday was a result of this proceeding.—C. P. R.
