Proton Council

Proton Council met at the village of Hopeville on Friday, Nov. 16th. Members of Council all present, the reeve LUDWIG MacKenzie, presiding. Minutes of last meeting read and on motion adopted.

Cooper—Wilson—That this council accept the petition of Luther Vert and others for the construction of a drain under the Municipal Drainage Act and the clerk instruct the township engineer to make the necessary plan and survey and report to council.

Wilson—Wright—That the reeve and assessor receive \$3 each and clerk \$4, for selecting jurors, and the assessor be paid 2.50, being balance on equising union school No. 10, West Luther and Proton.

McArdle—Wright—That Dr. James McWilliams be paid \$3.50 for visit to Peter Whittle.

McArdle—Wilson—That the sum of \$1.50 be accepted from Neil McDonald as taxes in full for his property, part lot 12, con. 12, for the year 1899, and clerk instruct County Treas. to erase the same from his book.

McArdle—Wilson—That the collector receive from C. Stephenson the taxes placed against him on the roll, less the sum of \$2, he having performed labor on the road as shown by certificate of pathmaster.

Wright—McArdle—That Mr. Howes com. of West Luther be paid \$8.80, being Proton's share, cleaning drain No. 21, West Luther and Proton.

Wilson—Cooper—That the following parties be paid for work, Div 1—John Devine for gravel \$9.45, John Brown repairing culvert on townline P. & E., Proton's share, \$1, Colin Ray work 27 sideroad, con. 5, \$6.75, W. H. Ellis digging ditch con. 4, \$6.25 grant, James Shees gravelling on 22 sideroad \$5 Thomas Ryan gravel \$1.50, P. McGrath repairing culvert on con. 4 \$1, Wm. Brown for work on con. 4, \$6 grant.

Cooper—McArdle—in Div. 2—Ainsworth Jack repairing bridge on 17 sideroad \$3 grant, James McKay gravelling on con. 9, \$3, Chas. Gillies digging culvert \$2.50.

Wright—McArdle—in Div. 3—Wm. McNulty ditching on con. 16 at lot 23, \$6.80, and repairing bridge on con. 16, 50 cents, H. Anderson gravelling on 12 sideroad, \$2, Jos. Billings ditching on base line Div. 3 and 5, \$5 grant, G. Haw for gravel, \$2.90, Thos. Ferris for gravel, \$14.0, Wm. Richardson repairing bridge on 7 sideroad con. 18, \$55 grant.

Cooper—McArdle—in Div. 4—Peter Smith for bridge on 27 sideroad \$13 grant, Thos. Johnson repairing culverts \$6, C. Vanalsine repairing culverts \$3, Geo. Woolsey repairing approach to bridge \$2 grant, Wm. Wright work on 27 sideroad \$8.75, John Wilson same place \$9 being money received from the sale of timber on road allowance. Thos. Wiltshire \$6.80 for balance on ditch in Div. 3, 4 and 5 grant, A. Carr plank for bridge \$3 grant, Geo. W. Cole, \$12.50, Wm. Gordon repairing bridge \$2, K. Goodfellow road job Div. 4 and 5 \$4.

McArdle—Wright—in Div. 5—Joseph Bowler for building bridge on T. L. Proton and Artemesia—Proton's \$7.50, grant, and road job \$6.75, J. Brown for road job \$5, Geo. Moore for gravel \$2.30, J. Moore for gravel \$5.

Wright—Wilson—That David Allen be paid \$8.85 for coffin and relieving same for Peter Whittle an indigent, Wm. McNulty digging grave \$1.

Wright—Wilson—That H. E. Glendinning be paid for stationery for Township \$2.50, T. H. Blacklock drainage bills and tax slips \$3.50, Municipal World supplies for Clerk \$3.50.

Cooper—Wright—That Geo. Sagman be paid for gravel Div. 4 \$2.85, Div. 2 \$8.10 and for repairing culvert Div. 2 75 cents, work on 32 sideroad \$1.50.

Cooper—Wilson—That the Treasurer receive from J. A. Cooper \$17.75 being the amount realized from sale of timber on 27 sideroad between Con. 7 and 9.

Wright—Wilson—That the Commissioner of Div. No. 3 be empowered to have railing placed on logs back on 25 sideroad as soon as possible.

McArdle—Cooper—That a grant of \$10 be given to make road at lot 6, con. 8.

Wilson—Cooper—That Geo. Wright be empowered to have ditch deepened at lot 18, con. 14, to be carried to a sufficient outlet.

McArdle—Wright—That the clerk be instructed to write Wm. Woods, late of Proton, now residing at Con. in the County of Wellington, and request him to return to Duncan McKenzie all handcuffs and batons in his possession.

Cooper—Wilson—That the council receive their pay up to date, 14 days for drain No. 15 and 14 days on township business.

Cooper—Wilson—That the council do now adjourn to meet at Hopeville on Friday, December 15, at the hour of 10 a. m.—Herald.

There was taken to Guelph jail last Friday by Constable Beau, Elora, a youth of 12 years, who has been committed for trial, on the charge of horse stealing by Magistrate Burns, of that village. The boy's name is Lawrence Angell, his home being at Elora. It is said the little fellow feels his position keenly. He states that the offence with which he is charged, that of stealing a horse and buggy, was committed unintentionally and with no bad purpose. However, he has been committed to stand trial, and for his capture the constable is entitled to the reward of \$20 offered by the county for the apprehension of any horse thief. The case is an unprecedented one in the history of Wellington County. The lad had not been properly trained. He is willing to go to a reformatory and expressed the wish that he should be educated as a carpenter.—Rep.

It is said that between 85 and 90 deer were shot on the Bruce peninsula this fall. One would hardly think that the Transvaal would affect any person in Bruce county, and yet it does. Messrs Rowman & Zinkau of Southampton, who are heavy exporters in leather to Britain, had a contract to ship their goods at the close of the Montreal season at 20s, 6d., and now the price has been advanced to 30s.—Chesley Enterprise.
