CAPTURE OF TWO BUGGLARS.—A  
separate affray between the police  
and three burglars took place Monday  
morning at the Great Western Rail-  
way Station, London. The burglars

fuging robber. The latter fell and

found that the burglar had been

and there found the safe, taking away  
something in the neighborhood of \$1-  
00, nearly all of which was recovered  
in the parties arrested. They were  
so thoroughly provided with burglar  
tools. They are all middle aged,  
being 43 and the other 60; and  
have their names as Harry White and  
Athelw Alder, labourers, of Maccles-  
field, Lancashire. It is believed that

leaders of an expert gang of bank rob-  
bers. The police are on the track of  
the escaped robber, but have not yet  
secured him.
