At the time for returning the Collector's Rolls was further extended. Moved by Mr. Gilray, seconded by Mr. Boyd, that the County Treasurer be authorized to accept from William Peterson the sum of \$19.42, being the full amount of arrears of taxes chargeable against the S. 1 of lot 2, in the 3rd concession of Euphrasia, minus road work, as the road work has been performed, and that the Clerk transmit to the County Treasurer a copy of this resolution.—carried.

Moved by Mr. Boyd, seconded by Mr. Gilray, that the Report of the Committee appointed to make a final settlement with John Cragston, Collector, for the years 1878-79 be accepted, and that the amount of balance due which is shown to be \$7.00 be accepted by the Treasurer as he was of payment in full. But that if any error should appear in future in any of Mr. Cragston's reports, etc., that he be still held responsible for such amount.—carried.

A petition signed by James Paterson, and 27 others asking relief for Mrs. J. Mick was laid before the Council, and the Reeve issued an order on the Treasurer for \$10, for said purpose. The Reeve's order was issued in favour of John Abercrombie for the sum of \$85, as payment of expenses and labour performed in taking care of C. L. Wyden, an indigent, during sickness. Said amount to cover also expenses of his burial.

Money Orders were issued in favour of Thomas Jordan for \$50, being salary as Collector for the year 1880, and in favour of G. Richardson for \$6, expenses of Arbitration concerning work on Nelson's hill, Town line Euphrasia and Artoesia.

The Clerk was ordered to get 500 copies of the Minutes of Council for last year together with the Auditors' Reports, published in pamphlet form. On motion being made and seconded, the Council adjourned until the next Saturday in May, and will then meet as a Court of Revision, at ten o'clock a.m., in the Township Hall.

Some of the stones were more than an inch across and of an irregular shape. Some clear as glass while others were opaque and white, and some were in the shape of a potato with four or five small ones attached. We picked up seven which completely covered the palm of the hand, and no trace alike. There was no wind the time the large hail fell. We did not hear of any damage being done.—Review.
