

A MIGHT FOR A GIRL.

A despatch from Portland, Me., says:—On the 14th inst. S. W. McGerry, of Ogdensburg, has information that his daughter, not yet fourteen years old, was to be married to a rather dissolute young man. The bans were published some time ago in the Catholic Church, and the wedding was to have taken place on the 16th. The father found his daughter at the dressmaker's, took her by force and drove with her to Muir. The disappointed groom and friends telegraphed to certain parties in Muir to stop McGerry, and followed after in hot pursuit. McGerry was met by a mob, who were too many for him; so he telegraphed here for 24 men, and 15 or 20 have gone to his relief, armed for a fight. At last Sport McGerry had his daughter in a hotel at Muir and was gazing the door with a revolver. The priest was here this morning to perform the ceremony. He did not know that the marriage of girls under sixteen years were forbidden, and on being so informed declared he would not perform the ceremony for any consideration. A number of prominent men are taking part in the trouble.
