EUPHRASIA COUNCIL.

The council met on Saturday, 5th, at Rocklyn. Members all present. Minutes of last session read and ordered to be printed.

The auditor's report was adopted, and ordered to be printed. The committee's report, re collector U.S.A., was accepted, satisfactory, and laid before the council to be handed over to him.

The county treasurer was requested to make \$15 charged against lot 9, con. 9, for state labour, as it is now made to appear that the labour for 1880 and 1881 was performed in the town.

The co. treasurer is requested to divide the areas of taxes now standing against lot 9, con. 9, arranging the matter so that the north quarter, 50 acres, and the southern portion, 150 acres, pay a just portion of the said areas.

J. R. Rawlin's communication received and laid aside.

Committee's report re 3 and 4 side has adopted. Mr. Ellis to deal with the matter.

Taxes charged against 184 acres S.E. lot 6, con. 9 in error, struck off, and the treasurer to receive copy of this resolution.

The Reeve authorised to discharge a bond given by the law. Mr. Jas. Dales, dated March 4, 1887, and long since satisfied.

7th line, lot 25, complained to be in dangerous condition. The Reeve to investigate, and act according to his judgment.
