

NEWSPAPER LAWS.

1. A postmaster is required to give notice as follows (returning the paper does not answer the law) when a subscriber does not take his paper out of the office, and state the reasons for its not being taken. Any neglect to do so makes the postmaster responsible to the publisher for the payment of the paper.

2. Any person who takes a paper from the post office, whether directed to his name or not, is responsible for the payment of the paper.

3. If a paper ordered by a paper distributor, but not paid for, is delivered, the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made, and collect the whole amount, whether it be taken from the office or not. There can be no legal discontinuance until payment is made.
