A LETTER FROM WINNIPEG.

So much has been written about
the North-west, that I presume many
are becoming weary of perusing news-
paper articles on Manitoba.
The following, however, may be of
interest.
Winnipeg, the Prairie City of the
North-west, still moves onward, and
has within the last year added 16,000
to her population. Where but a few
years ago the old Indian trail wended
its way along the banks of the Red
River from Point Douglas to the Old
Fort, now stands one of the best com-
mercial thoroughfares in British A-
merica. Leaving Main Street one
is astonished to see how rapidly the
buildings are running up; scattered
hovels have given place to permanent
and beautiful structures, well graded
streets and wide sidewalks.

Canvas tents stand in great numbers
in the suburbs; all sizes and shapes,
occupied by men of all ranks, from
the most illiterate to the most en-
lightened; men who have barely
survived the panic of some financial
disaster in an older country; men
whose hands have become horny by
toil; and men whose hands have not
been soiled with work. Some of them
and sons of toil intermingle, and
not a grumble arises from either of
them. Among others I met with our
old friends E. D. Wilcox and W.
Lyons in Brandon, with their oxen
and equipments. They have selected
a pleasant spot in the west, where
their Markdale friends will find a com-
fortable retreat, and receive a hearty
shake of the hand—not a hand soiled
as that which a few months ago man-
ipulated pearls and jewels in Markdale
but the hard hand of a western yeo-
man.

Winnipeg is well adapted to enter-
tain all classes, from the curly haired
sailing of society to the reckless
spendthrift.
New churches are numerous, and
are well attended. In politics, Mani-
toba fails to connect. Party politics
have hitherto been unknown, but the
line of demarcation is being drawn,
and a faction fight expected.

As the provincial legislature is now
in session, I have occasionally visited
that political wigwag where wisdom
is supposed to govern the council of
the people. Oratory, genius, wit and
humour are never heard within the
walls of the bar-like building in which
they assemble.
