On motion, a committee was appointed  
to enquire into the case and  
report to the council.

Warden read a large number of communi-  
cations.

Dr. Christie made an enquiry of the  
Warden in reference to the rumors  
current for some days past in regard  
to the neglect of the gaol surgeon,  
whereby the life of a woman confined  
in the gaol was endangered.

The Warden replied that he had  
heard of the case from the gaoler, who  
said the gaol surgeon with Dr. Lang  
had visited the woman, who was  
near her confinement and the gaol sur-  
geon had told him Dr. Lang would at-  
tend to the case; but while Dr. Lang  
was out he had to be found, and he had  
to attend to the case of Gray, and Dr.  
Christie said that he understood  
that the gaol surgeon visited the wo-  
man on Thursday morning, and had  
stayed two hours, but then left her.

The woman was in pain of delivery  
from Wednesday till Saturday, when  
it was thought she would die, and Dr.  
Barnhart was sent for, and found that  
the woman would never have been de-  
livered without surgical aid, which was  
afforded, and she was delivered about  
1 o'clock on Sunday morning. He  
said it was a crying shame on the  
country of Grey that in a case of  
neglect should have occurred.
