EUPHRASIA COUNCIL. The council met as a court of revision on June 2nd, 1882. Members all present. The following action was taken in reference to appeals and applications made concerning the assessment roll: George Hutchinson's assessment confirmed. Samuel Cooper's assessment reduced \$100 on personal property. Joseph Myers' assessment confirmed. Samuel Gilbert, assessment confirmed. William McElroy's assessment reduced \$100 on personal property. Robert Doolop, assessment on 9th line confirmed. Archibald Londry's assessment confirmed. William Meyer, placed on assessment roll as farmer's son. William Garbutt assessed jointly with Robert Garbutt. William D'Orlé assessed for W. E. 1st, con. 10. James Convery assessed for N. E. lot 8, con. 12. Henry Thompson placed on the roll as farmer's son. John Neil assessed for S. J. E. 1st lot 19, con. 5, and John Langtree notified to this effect. James M. Langtree assessed for N. E. part lot 24, con. 5. Thomas Douglas assessed as tenant for W. J. lot 80, con. 9, and John Douglas entered on the roll as owner. W. O. Smith, Esq., banker, Thornbury, assessed for S. J. lot 6, con. 3, instead of James Hodson. John Boyd assessed for E. J. lot 21, con. 8, at a valuation of \$1400. The court adjourned until 10 o'clock a.m. on Wednesday, 14th inst. Council resumed. Minutes of last session of council read and confirmed. Moved by Mr. Gilray, seconded by Mr. Myler, that the motion refusing to have by-law No. 318, read a third time be rescinded, and that said by-law be now read a third time and finally passed. Lost. The report of the committee relative to the repairs on Sauguen bridge was accepted, the work to be proceeded with at an early opportunity. Mr. Jordan's time for collecting the rates of 1881 was extended until the 1st July next, and then to be finally settled up. Proposals were made by Mr. Dodson and Mr. Mitchell to furnish road scrapers to the corporation if required. W. H. Dodson was requested to furnish six road scrapers for the use of this municipality. The Reeve was authorized to confer with the Reeve of Collingwood, relative to repairs required on the town roads 2 and 3, as it appears that the road at that place is dangerous to the travelling public. The Reeve and Mr. Fawcett were appointed a committee to wait on St. Vincent council on business in reference to the improvement of the town of Fisherton, and interconnect stations on the 25th inst. with a view to the improvement of the town.
