SPONTANEOUS COMBUSTION. - Some exterials, wadding, raw flax, hemp, the waste monstrate the important fact, among others, that small quantities really take fire sooner than large ones. The substances named were saturated with various fluids-oils, turpentine, petroleum, various varnishes, etc. All the fibrous materials took fire wood-dust, on the contrary, proved to be entirely harmless. Combustion ensued most rapidly with 17 grains of wadding, and 67 grains of a strong oil varnish, namely, in thirty-seven minutes, while 200 grains of washed cotton waste, of which a portion was saturated with 750 grains of strong about it, required a period of well nigh fourteen hours. 
