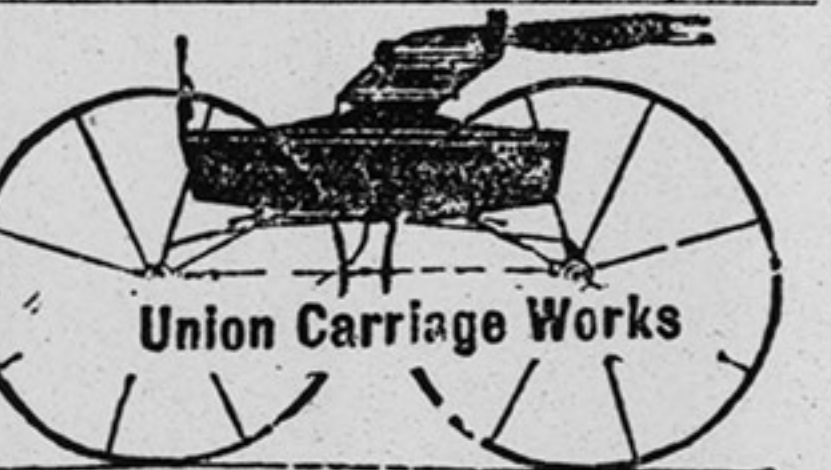

The distance from Montreal to Cal-
andar is given as 355 miles, Callandar
to Thunder Bay 450, Thunder Bay to
Winnipeg 435, Winnipeg to Calgary
800 and Calgary to Port Moody 610;
2,850 miles. A comparative table of
distances shows that while it is 2,850
miles from Montreal to Port Moody
by the C. P. R., it is 2,931 from New
York to San Francisco by the shortest
possible route, a difference of 81
miles in favor of the Canadian line,
and from Liverpool to Yokohama, in
Japan, the route by the Canadian Pa-
cific is over 1,010 miles shorter than
that by New York and San Francisco

Artemesia.
This council met in the town hall,
Flesherston, on Monday Aug. 2nd.
Communication from Haney laid
over until next meeting.
Messrs Oliver and Brodie waited on
council re grant to Artemesia agricul-
tural society. Messrs Munshaw and
Damude waited upon council re drain-
ing swamp near Flesherston cemetery.
Mr. Duncan Campbell waited upon
council re grant to repair valley road.
Mr. Sloan waited upon council re grant
to complete drain on 10th con-
swamp.

A petition from John Teeter and
others was presented and read.
Treasurer's monthly statement pre-
sented and read, showing a balance of
cash on hand \$289.00.
Reports of Messrs. Wright and
Webster re gravel road grants presen-
ted and read.

By-laws 342, 343, 344, & 345, to
levy rates, school rates, police trustees
rates, and to permit T. G. & B. R. to
place cattle guard on road allowance,
were passed.
\$20 granted to Artemesia agricul-
tural society. (Yeas, Curstoe, Web-
ster, Elliott, Nays, Wright, Pedlar).
\$20 was granted to drain the swamp
petitioned by police trustees of Flesh-
erton.

Orders in favour of G. Duncan for
\$7.40 and W. Parks for \$4 were is-
sued and charge to ward 3.
The following accounts for repairing
Boyne water bridge were paid.—A.
Malloy, \$2, G. McKenzie \$1.25, W.
Tucker \$1.25 J. T. Wright \$1.25,
and Thorp Wright \$2.
\$20 granted to complete ditching
on 10th con. swamp road.

A sum not to exceed \$20 was granted
as an equivalent to amount ap-
propriated by Glenelg to improve town
line between Glenelg and Artemesia
from base line at Welsh's to gravel
road.
The reeve issue orders for road jobs
in ward 3, as follows: Wm. Tucker
\$2.25, D. McKenzie, \$3, and George
McKenzie, \$1.25.

The reeve issued orders in road jobs
in Ward 4, as follows: So'mon Tur-
ner \$15.00, G. Fisher \$14.70.
