

The distance from Montreal to Cal andar is given as 355 miles, Callandar to Thunder Bay 450, Thunder Bay to Winnipeg 435, Winnipeg to Calgarry 800 and Calgarry to Port Moody 610; 2,850 miles. A comparative table of distances shows that while it is 2,850 miles from Montreal to Port Moody by the C. P. R., it is 3,331 from New York to San Francisco by the shortest possible route, a difference of 481 miles in favor of the Canadian line, and from Liverpool to Yokohama, in Japan, the route by the Canadian Pacific is over 1,010 miles shorter than that by New York and San Francisco
