

GLENELG COUNCIL

The council met at the Townhall Aug 15. All the members were present. Communications from Artemesia and Egremont respecting grants to town lines were read.

The following accounts were passed: J. Rutherford, printing \$28 50 C. W. Rutledge, printing 21 36 S. H. McKettrick, road scrapers 28 75 R. Bull, funeral expenses, McFadyen and Wilkins 16 75 Freight on Road scrapers 2 55

The offer of the collectors of Moses Leslie and John Saunders in the matter of compensation for roadway taken by township was accepted, viz: \$180 for roadway on lots 99 and 100, con. 3, W. T. & G. R., and \$100 for roadway on lot 22, con. 11. Deeds to be free from all incumbrance, and according to a plan made by W. R. Rombough, P.I.S., and bearing date Aug. 13, 1874.

\$20 was granted for Egremont town line between lots 15 & 20; and \$10 at cons. 1 and 2, being equivalents to the Egremont grants.

\$40 was granted for Artemesia town line opposite ward 2 Gleneig; being equivalent to Artemesia grant.

The reeve and road commissioners were appointed to examine bridges, and make the necessary repairs.

The treasurer was authorized to accept \$32 16, being in full of arrears of taxes lot 7, con. 3, E.G.R.

The following collectors were appointed: Ward 1, Robt. Moffat; 2, W.H. Arrowsmith; 2, T. Cook; 4, John Hart.

Total rates levied 77-10 cent; from the 3rd exclusive of school rates.

Council adjourned till Oct. 2.

The Game Laws

Group pheasants and partridge shall not be taken between 1st Jan. & 1st Oct.

Snipe shall not be taken between 1st Jan. & 15th Aug.

Mallard, grey duck, black duck, wood or summer duck shall not be hunted between 1st Jan. & 15th Aug.

The eggs of any of the above mentioned birds are not to be taken.

No batteries, smoken prints or night lights shall be used for taking any swine, geese, or ducks at any time.

No traps or nets shall be set for the purpose of taking game birds at any time.

Hares shall not be taken between the 1st March and 1st Sept.

Deer shall not be taken between the 15th Dec. and 1st Oct.
