The position as regards the Toronto, Grey & Bruce and Northern North Western roads remains unchanged, so far as is known to the public. There seems to be no doubt, however, that a struggle for the possession of the lines is now going on between the Syndicate and Grand Trunk. We were informed by a well-known Railway man last week that there was scarcely a doubt that the Toronto, Grey & Bruce would go to the Syndicate, and that only a few days would elapse till the arrangement would be completed. Our informant seemed to think that both the Northern and North Western would also become Syndicate roads. Should all of these lines go to the Syndicate our position would be better than that of our rival Collingwood; and for the reason that we can obtain a branch from the Grand Trunk by a short line of 12 or 13 miles, while there would be no chance of a competing line being built to Collingwood. We trust, however, the result will be that the lines leading to Owen Sound and Collingwood will go into the hands of rival companies.—Advertiser.
