FIRE IN DURHAM .- About half past nine o'clock this morning the bell of Trinity church rang out a fire alarm, and on looking out we noticed that hnge volumes of smoke were crossing Garafraxa Street. On proceeding in the direction indicated we discovered that a large wood shed, almost close to the residence of Mr. Alexander Robertson, in rear of the Town Hall was all ablaze, and it looked almost as if there would be a general conflagration of a large portion of the Town. Fortunately the fire was not far from the river, and a line of our! townsmen was quickly formed and pails supplied from the neighbouring stores, a strong stream of water was soon being emptied on the fire on that side, and a similar line was formed on the other side to Mr. McAlister's pump, and by the combined efforts of the two lines and the energetic way in which the men worked the fire was principally confined to the shed in which it originated, although it burned very fiercely for nearly an hour. The corner of the house and a shed belonging to the McAlister House was much charred, and were often blazing up, but the fire was at last subdued. Mr. Robertson was lying sick at the time. A quantity of the furniture was removed from the house, its self was not seriously damaged. There is some insurance on the place. We did not learn the amount of the loss, but should judge it not to be over \$200. It was gratifying to see the manner in which the fire was subdued by the residents of the town, thus preventing what might have been a great calamity. But it was a narrow escape. 
