## OSPREY COUNCIL.

This Council met at Maxwell, on the 13th inst. All the members present. Minutes of last meeting adopted.

Communications and papers received—From W. Ferguson, P. S. Inspector, re children between 5 and 16 on assessment roll. From Clerks of Melancthon, Nottawasaga and Collingwood, and from Trustees of S. S. 2 and 8, requisitions for school moneys. From County Judge, certified voters' list. From B. S. Kerr, notice of dangerous places on roads. From W. Pearson, bill for plank \$2.83. From Clerk, Collector's Roll for 1882. From Melancthon Council, plan and specification of drainage outlet.

McIntyre, Speers, that Allan Bell receive a grant of \$10, to open sideroad 35 southward.

Johnston, McIntyre, that Joseph Taylor repair Whitson's hill on the gravel road. Taylor, Speers, that W. Pearson be paid \$2.83 for 472 feet of plank purchased in 1881 by J. R. Sing, for culverts on townline and omitted to be paid by him.

Speers, Johnston, that E. Horton be paid \$6.00 for repairing Faversham bridge. The Reeve of Euphrasia, Messrs Grier and Hicking appeared before the Council asking cooperation in opening the townline between Artemesia and Osprey, from Con. 14, northward.

Speers, McGirr, that the road and bridge committee meet the Artemesia committee and inspect the townline between Artemesia and Osprey, on the 14th Con., and report to this Council, and that the Clerk notify Artemesia council to appoint the date of meeting.

The Collector appeared before the Council with his bondsmen.

Moved by Mr. Speers, seconded by Mr. McIntyre, that the Collectors' sureties be accepted the bond signed and handed to the Treasurer for safe keeping, and that the clerk hand the roll to the Collector.

Taylor, Speers, that Thomas Johnston be appointed to come with the Clerk or Reeve of Melancthon, respecting that part of the Melancthon drain extending into the municipality, and that he have power to let the job if necessary.

Speers, Johnston, that the Clerk notify D. K. Preston, to cause the haul on the 10th sideroad, opposite the O. Hall, Charleston, to be filled by Statute labor. Speers, Johnston, that this council adjourn to meet at Faversham, on 11th Nov. at 10 o'clock. W. MILNE, Cler.
