

**ONTARIO HIGH SCHOOLS.**

The following regulations were approved by the lieutenant governor in council on Saturday:

Drawing is removed from the obligatory subjects of study in the lower school and at the intermediate. The item 7 e. now 6 e, in the optional subjects thereat, shall therefore read, 'French or German, and when selected by the parent or guardian of such pupil music or drawing.'

In the subject of English literature, prescribed by the order in the council of the 31st March last, Goldsmith's Traveller or Marmion may be used by any pupil in the high schools or candidate at the departmental examinations in July next, as the parent or guardian may select.
