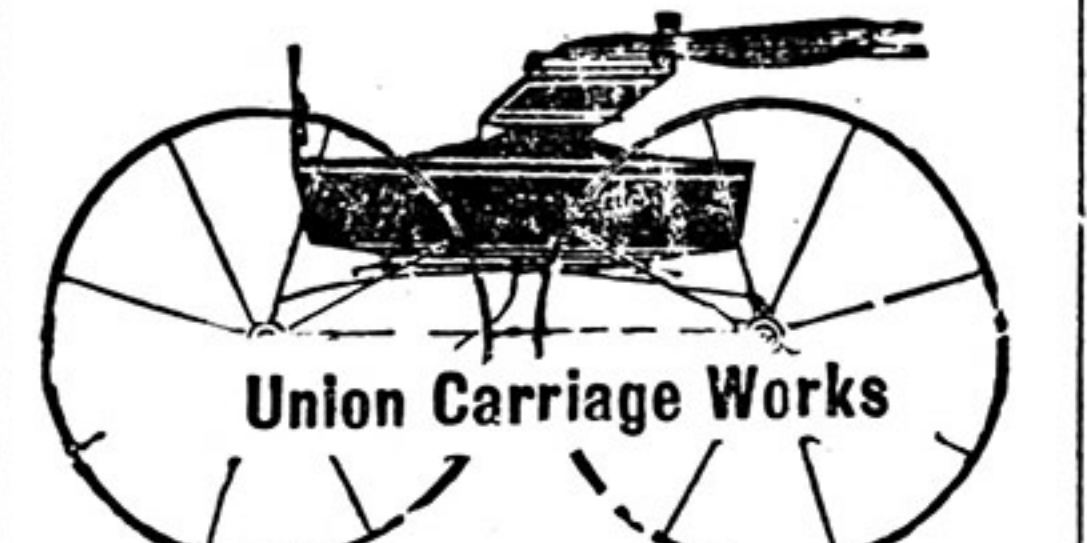

al stores, and prospects for a smart town.
The place is healthy and water good. A large
number of good settlers are in that district.
The following are some of the market prices:
Flour, \$3.50 per hundred; Oats, per bushel,
\$1; Hay, per ton, \$25 to \$30; Oat Meal, 8
cents per pound; Sugar, 6 lbs. for \$1.
