It is one of the best markets on the line of the T. G. & B. R., and has store-room for any quantity of grain. The very appearance of our large elevators give a favorable impression to strangers coming in, many of which remark, "this must be a good country or they would not require such large storehouses," and on leaving "we seldom strike a place of the size which does the amount of business." The two new elevators are now in full blast, which together with the sleighing the past few days has made quite a stir.

And now the question arises, how can we hold the large trade? The keen competition of our enterprising business men, together with the superior quality of work turned out by our mechanics, has been successful in drawing a trade, in many instances from a distance over bad roads. 




