

Dr. McLellan of Toronto, delivered addresses on "The art of Questioning", "Intelligent teaching of simple rules" and "The Teacher and his work." Mr. Tait, of Collingwood, gave addresses on "Text books, what the are and what they ought to be" and also on "How to teach Geometry to beginners" Mr. McCabe, of Durham read a paper on "The Teacher's position and his salary."
